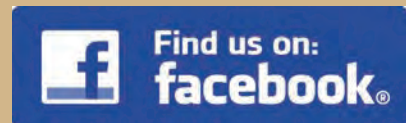

It is not always convenient to be a good Steward, especially when all the temptations of our busy and materialistic world get in the way. Now add our own pride and ego into the equation and **living a Stewardship lifestyle may be downright uncomfortable!** Remember, God didn't call us to be comfortable. He never said that we would have an easy life. Rather, He called us to be faithful!



From the Pastor's Desk

God, Are You There?

Dear Parishioners,

Does God ever stop thinking about us?

I realize that from a human perspective we can sometimes wonder if God actually hears our prayers or if God knows and cares about us *individually*. Let's stop and think about this for a moment. If God is truly **God** (as Christians understand *God* to be) then we are—*without a doubt*—constantly known and unconditionally loved. God sees and hears everything that we think, say and do. God never takes His focus off of us—not even for a nanosecond. It's impossible. "*Even all the hairs of your head are counted.*" (Mt. 10:30)

Knowing this, does it mean that we no longer have problems and difficulties? Might we not have *even more* questions, for that matter? *Why do bad things happen to good people? Why does it sometimes seem that God does not answer our prayers?*

Truly, we do not see as God sees. We are limited, finite beings. We are situated in time. We are not God.

What I have come to realize over many years is that I am called to *trust in God*, to *have faith in God—completely*. I do not have all the answers. I do not know the course of world events. I cannot see into the future. In fact, I am totally dependent on the *Providence of God*. It is the Grace of God that sustains me in all my endeavors.

Is this a cop-out? Am I naive or overly simplistic? I don't think so. In humility, I must realize **all** that we have been given (revelation) through the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. God became *one of us*. In Jesus, God became finite and tangible. Humans could see, touch and hear Him. The Almighty also became subject to suffering and death.

In fact, God the Father revealed essential, life-giving **truth** to us through His Son. He also sent His Holy Spirit to strengthen and guide us. From all this we can begin to see and appreciate how much God truly loves us. "*For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.*" (Jn. 3:16) Jesus' entire life and ultimate death on the cross was no accident but a divine statement of God's self-giving love.

As humans, we are called to be mindful of God. Our limited intellectual capacity unfortunately does not think of God all the time. We forget quickly. We get easily distracted. We struggle with doubt. Nevertheless, remembering to pray and worship God on a regular basis—to have a routine, structured prayer life—benefits *us* tremendously in our quest to be faithful to God as God is ever-faithful to us. Stick with it, even when we do not perceive any tangible results.

I wish that I could give people all the answers that they desire concerning faith and trust in God. I too get frustrated when God seems to *delay* in responding to a prayer request. I do not understand why good people have to suffer.

Yet, I know that God sees and hears. I trust that God wants what is best for me, for all of us. "*Trust God at all times, my people! Pour out your hearts to God our refuge!*" (Ps. 82:9)

I simply must continue to trust—*completely*.

*“A reading from St. Paul’s 2nd Letter to Timothy 3-14; 4-2”
“Remain faithful to what you have learned and believed, because you know from whom you learned it, and that from infancy you have known the sacred Scriptures, which are capable of giving you wisdom*

for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work. I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingly power: proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage; through all patience and teaching.”

These words are addressed to us these days. Persistence and consistence go together, hand in hand. Living our FAITH has always required these two virtues and always will. Resistance is a third word needed to resist evil but be open to JESUS’s teaching. There is much to do to pass on the FAITH to our children for us adults.

Parents: thank you for registering your children in our Sunday classes. What we can do here in 75 minutes on Sunday morning is very little, most of the teaching about our FAITH goes on at home, in the family, extended family and Catholic traditions. Thus, parents, don’t leave it up to the Catechists to accomplish your teaching part. They are merely trying to fulfill their own task, hardly enough to sustain our children’s FAITH for their lifetime. Yes, we do give some home assignments for our children’s independent deepening, and for continuity purposes. YES, children do need to memorize some prayers and truths of our FAITH. YES, in most cases some time can be found during the week for them to review their previous lesson and pray on their own.

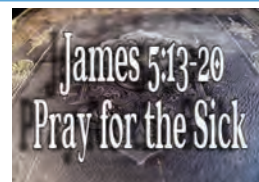

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

The Gospel for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 23, 2022- Luke 18:9-14

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity - greedy, dishonest, adulterous - or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Commentary:

Most of us grew up seeking rewards for a "job well done." Most of us desire the affirmation of a pleasant reward at the end of a hard work week. Is it surprising that we want the same affirmation from God that we're doing a good job keeping the commandments and following the rules of life? But the truth is; we don't have to seek God's approval. We're already loved beyond imagination, and forgiven beyond reason. All we have to do is what that humble tax collector does: admit that we are sinners. That won't make God mad. It makes us eligible for God's mercy.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

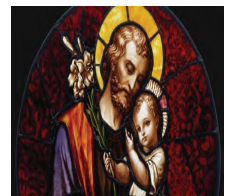

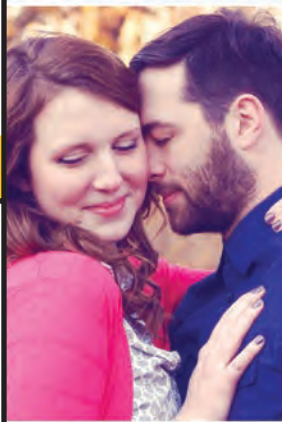
