From the Pastor's Desk

Listening to a Ukrainian Archbishop

Dear Parishioners,

As I write today, I am attending our annual Presbyteral Convocation, which is fancy terminology for a meeting or gathering of priests. We are in Avalon for three days enjoying some priestly fraternity, listening to and reflecting on a few talks, sharing some meals and discussions, praying together and honoring our priest jubilarians at Mass and being encouraged to minister with more dedication and love for all of you, my parishioners.

This year's guest speaker is the **Most Rev. Borys Gudziak, Archbishop-Metropolitan for Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia**. Some information from his official biography:

Archbishop Borys Gudziak was born in **1960** in Syracuse, New York, the son of immigrants from Ukraine. He earned a bachelor's degree in philosophy and biology from Syracuse University in **1980** and then studied in Rome, in the circle of Patriarch Josyf Slipyj. He received a STB degree in theology from the Pontifical Urban University in **1983** and then returned to America to pursue a doctorate in Slavic and Byzantine Cultural History at Harvard University, which he successfully defended in **1992**. In **1995** he earned a licentiate in Eastern Christian studies from the Pontifical Oriental Institute.

In **1992**, Borys Gudziak moved to Lviv where he founded and directed (1992-2002) the Institute of Church History. In **1993**, he was appointed Chairman of the Commission for the Renewal of the Lviv Theological Academy. From **1995 until 2000**, he served as Vice Rector of the Lviv Theological Academy, then as Rector from **2000 to 2002**. In that year, Gudziak became Rector of the Ukrainian Catholic University (founded on the basis of the Academy), and in **2013** its President.

Ordained as a priest on November 26, 1998, Gudziak was appointed Bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church in France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxembourg and Switzerland in **2012**. The official enthronement ceremony as Metropolitan Archbishop of Philadelphia of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church took place on **June 4, 2019** in the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Philadelphia. Archbishop Gudziak became the seventh Metropolitan Archbishop of the Archeparchy of Philadelphia of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church.

Archbishop Gudziak has appeared regularly on leading global TV channels and media providing expert commentary.

He has received numerous international awards and distinctions. Having written many articles and books, he travels globally giving lectures and talks on theology, history, spirituality, education, society, and current challenges in Ukraine. He speaks English, Ukrainian, Italian, Polish, French, Russian, and German. He is an honorary citizen of Lviv, Ukraine.

The Archbishop gave the priests two talks based on the words of the Mass describing Jesus' consecration of the Holy Eucharist, and then presented his unique perspective on the war in Ukraine during a third talk. I am currently digesting his words and insights for use at a later time.

This evening, during the Mass (the feast of St. Luke the Evangelist), we will honor our priest jubilarians celebrating 25, 40, 50 and 60 years of ordained priesthood. I watch as our diocesan priests grow older with the number fewer. I see how many foreign-born clergy, fortunately, now supply what the decreasing number of our own native-born clergy are unable to do.

What will the future hold for the Diocese of Camden? Only the Lord knows for certain. However, today we celebrate the ministry of those who have answered the call to priesthood and have remained faithful to it. Ad multos annos!

One phrase that stands out from the first reading this Sunday is *“The one who serves God willingly is heard; his petition reaches the heavens.”* Do we serve the Lord to the extent that pleases us, that is comfortable and desirable to us, as long as God behaves according to our personal standards? Do we put forth many excuses so that we don’t do what we should do, and we create our own moral standards? In other words, do we change our beliefs to justify our actions? Relativism is a mask. (Dr. Sri) We hear the many excuses as to why Catholics aren’t attending Mass, or receiving JESUS. It is good to remember that one way to serve GOD, is to Keep God’s Day HOLY, and for us Catholics it means attending MASS. Do we make excuses for not being present on Sunday? Many of us can remember when we walked to church on dirt, muddy paths, with hardly the right clothes to keep warm and our churches were not heated or air conditioned. But we were there, our families were there. We had wisdom about values, and GOD had the right place in our life. Today, there are cars, paved roads, heated and air-conditioned Churches. What is it that keeps us from Mass? Now we realize that **more is not better; that more can become a distraction** from the real values of life,



that more fills our life with clutter and we become distracted from our true purpose. *We have an important task to teach our children: to live simply with what they need and be happy with what GOD always provides.*

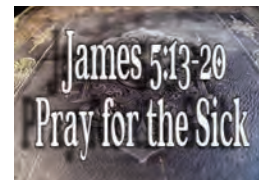

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 30, 2022 - Luke 19:1-10

Zacchaeus was a chief tax collector. He was not too popular with the townspeople. Zacchaeus was a short man. He heard that Jesus was coming to town so he climbed a tree in order to better view Jesus. Jesus rewards Zacchaeus by eating in his home. Grumbling takes place. People complain to Jesus. Zacchaeus said, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house because this man, too, is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Commentary:

Luke is the only evangelist who records the incident about the tax collector, Zacchaeus. Last Sunday's Gospel showed God's acceptance of the sinful tax collector. Today's Gospel provides a concrete example of how repentance is worked out in reality. With total, unconditional acceptance of Zacchaeus, Jesus actually goes into the sinner's house to eat with him. The tax collector is touched by Jesus' love and is willing to rid himself of the worldly possessions that displace God's love. Jesus responds by calling him a "son of Abraham." Zacchaeus opens his heart to God's invitation and responds with grateful love.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



Pro-Life Corner: Building a Culture of Life in a Post- Roe World (cont.)

"Our nation is in desperate need of healing from the toxic polarization and anger that has poisoned so much of our politics in recent years. 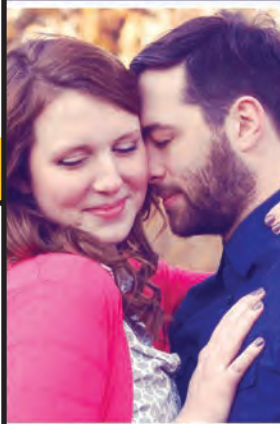
