From the Pastor's Desk A Tale of Two Churches

Dear Parishioners,

It has become more and more apparent to me that the Catholic Church is at a very serious crossroads. I have witnessed changes in the Church taking place for years now—almost my entire lifetime. However, some of the things I am currently witnessing are absolutely unprecedented.

Let me begin with something as simple as orientation of the priest at Mass. For centuries, the position of the priest was *ad orientem* (towards “liturgical” East). The priest faced the direction of the rising sun to lead prayer and remind us all of the rising of the Son of God. While some claimed that *he had his back to the people*, rather, it was the intention of this position in the Mass *to face God*. After all, we are worshipping Him, not the people. The focus, slowly and subtly, became more oriented to the *community* rather than to *God*. While people became accustomed to this new liturgical position with time, simultaneously the emphasis at Mass tended more toward *meal* rather than *sacrifice*. The community *meal seemed* to take precedent over the eternal **sacrifice** of Jesus to His Father. Then Holy Communion went from reception on the tongue while kneeling to reception in the hand while standing. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are now regularly scheduled (not so *extraordinary*, if you ask me) and are commonly referred to as Eucharistic “Ministers.” I could go on and on. These were just some of the many, many liturgical changes which followed.

What the situation in the Church has now morphed into is an attempt to change Church teaching and the very Church itself. The blessing of gay unions, “sinless” homosexual acts, reception of Holy Communion by divorced-remarried, women priests, a plurality of acceptable, salvific religions and many other questionable/heretical ideas are seemingly on the table. Popes in the past have warned against the heresy of *modernism* where **truth** becomes fluid and relativistic. Now it appears that *modernism* is rearing its ugly head right out in the open with seeming consent by various members of the Church hierarchy.

We see various high-ranking Vatican officials and Church leaders (cardinals, archbishops, bishops, a former papal nuncio, a former prefect for the congregation for the doctrine of the faith, etc.) *openly* criticizing what is now happening within the Catholic Church. *Wow!*

Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen warned of an upcoming, counterfeit Church—an ape of the Church. **Sr. Lucia**, one of the three **Fatima** seers, spoke of a “diabolic disorientation” within the Church and that the final battle between God and Satan would be over marriage and the family. **Pope St. Paul VI** spoke of the “smoke of Satan” within the sanctuary. **Our Lady of Good Success**, a lesser-known but still approved Marian apparition from Quito, Ecuador, predicted and warned humanity about the sins of modern society and a future struggle within the Church itself. **Pope St. John Paul II** admonished us concerning the “culture of death” permeating our society. There are many others who have given us vital warnings for our time. (I do not have the time and space in this bulletin article to address all of this. Please refer to my web site www.fr-ed-namiotka.com for further information.)

I trust God will act in some way to protect the Holy Catholic Church. I also know that our Blessed Mother will have some vital role in this process as she made it known at Fatima that in the end her *Immaculate Heart will triumph*. The exact details are certainly unknown to me and up to God Himself.

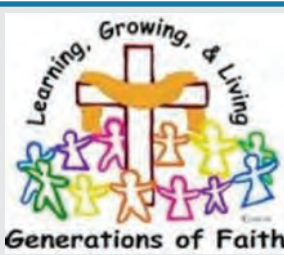
In the meantime, we all should be continually on our knees praying *fervently*. May God have mercy on us.

Thus, attending weekly worship at our parish, to be in communion with other believers, where JESUS gives us HIMSELF in the Eucharist, is no longer important to them.



With the Phillies in the world series, hours can be spent watching a game, celebrate a win or mourn a loss. Yet no longer are GOD's commands, praying with the community, being touched by JESUS own physical presence in US recognized as valuable for one's life.

Do we even consider the example of faith we are sharing with our children? Do we feel the sense of responsibility before GOD for our way of attracting and connecting them to JESUS and to our FAITH?

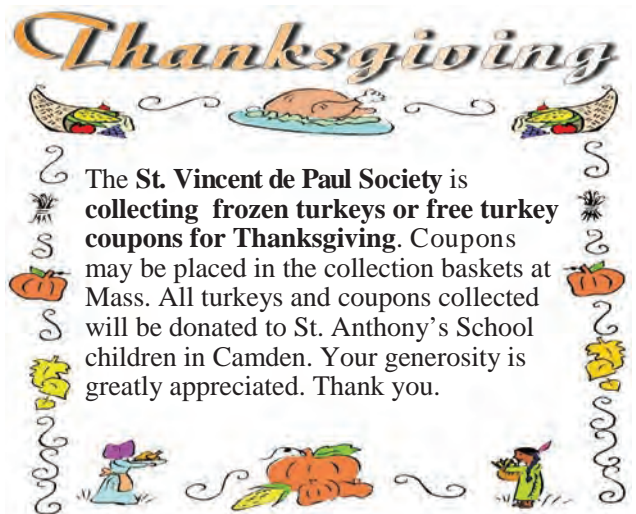

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, November 13, 2022- Luke 21:5-19

People were speaking about how the temple was adorned. Jesus tells them that a day will come when not one stone will be left upon another in this temple. It will be destroyed. The people ask Jesus when this will happen. What signs will there be? Jesus answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of war and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end."

Commentary:

As we approach the end of the Church year, the liturgy directs our thoughts to the end of time itself. For Jews and Christians this implies victory over all forces of evil, even death itself. A common theme in the writings about this end time is that it will be a time of crisis, a time of decision. Luke's main theme is that it will do no good to try to predict the end time. For followers of Jesus, the important thing is to believe that God will be with them no matter what happens: "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

Pro-Life (January 27, 2017– Rep. Robert Alderholt, R-AL) "Our beliefs, our ideals, and our very way of being are almost entirely rooted in the way we were raised. The values that are

Refugee Facts and Figures

The average stay in a refugee camp is 17 years.

The average camp size is 480 sq. ft. per person of accessible camp area.

United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)

Of the 37 resettlement countries, the U.S. resettles less than 1% of the total refugees each year.

National Immigration Forum

The U.S. used to lead the world in refugee resettlement. The U.S. enacted the first refugee legislation in 1948 to help 250,000 Europeans after the Second World War. Later laws helped people fleeing communist regimes. Today only 18,000 refugees are admitted each year.

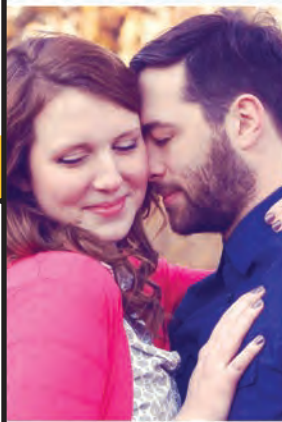
