### Stewardship Corner: 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time True Stewards

*“For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.” MATTHEW 5:20*

The Pharisees lived according to the letter of the law and they used this to elevate themselves above the other people. Jesus is clear. It's the love that you have in your heart, for God and others, that will get you to heaven. Simply following church rules to the letter and not out of love, does not necessarily put you on the path to heaven. *Attending Sunday Mass and then gossiping about a fellow parishioner in the parking lot is an example of being a modern-day Pharisee, not a true Steward.*



## From the Pastor's Desk Divide and Conquer

Dear Parishioners,

There is a Latin phrase *divide et impera* (*divide and conquer*) which refers to a military or political strategy used to defeat an opponent in battle. A similar principle can be used to break up and destroy an opponent, to cause division in an organization, to damage the unity of society, even to attempt to destroy a *church*.

Let's use a common example from family life. A teenager goes to her mom to get permission from her to go to the mall with her friends. Mom says "no" because she realizes that her daughter has loads of homework and she needs to finish the work first. What does the daughter do? She goes to dad to ask him if she can go to the mall (because she knows from past experience that she's *daddy's little girl*). Dad looks at her and says "okay" without realizing that mom has already said "no." The teenager *played dad off mom* and seems to win (at least for the moment).

If the parents are smart they will discuss the situation together first and stand united in their decision. Otherwise, the strategy worked. **Division** was caused and the teenager won. This can lead to an argument between the parents and further problems down the line.

Apply the principle of *divide and conquer* up the social ladder and you can see the damage that can be done. Challenge the definition of what a *marriage* or *family* is. Cause confusion as to *when human life begins* or *about someone's gender*. Openly question traditionally acceptable principles of morality and consider them *outdated*. Undermine the teaching authority of the church and encourage people *to do what feels right or good for them*.

**Jesus** teaches us: "Every kingdom divided against itself will be laid waste, and no town or house divided against itself will stand." (Mt. 12:25) **Abraham Lincoln** used a similar phrase when referring to slavery in America: "A house divided against itself cannot stand."

Let's add to this what **St. Paul** says about the *Body of Christ—the Church*: . . . *Living the truth in love, we should grow in every way into him who is the head, Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, with the proper functioning of each part, brings about the body's growth and builds itself up in love.* (Eph. 4: 15-16)

So when things happen that cause *division, dissent* or *disunity*, be on your guard. Question whether **love** is motivating the situation. Is **unity** being fostered? Or is *father* being pitted against *mother*, one family against another, one town against another, Republican against Democrat, priest against priest, parish against parish, cardinal against cardinal, bishop against bishop?

Creating *dissent* or *disunity* will ultimately lead to the downfall and destruction of us all. Something that is **diabolical** (from the *Greek*, meaning *to cast apart*) reveals *Satan* (and not God) ultimately behind the confusion and disunity.

I go back time and time again to a phrase of my patron saint, **Maximilian Kolbe**: "Only love is creative." God wants us unified under His Divine Rule. Satan wants our destruction. He wants the chaos and confusion. May we all work to bring about unity (not division) in the **Body of Christ—the Church**.

Otherwise, the consequences will be devastating for us all.

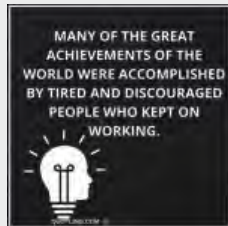

**From the readings for the 6<sup>th</sup> Sun. in Ordinary Time, year A**

*“Eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and has not entered the human heart, about what God has prepared for those who love him”.*

There are many speculations on life after physical death and some are very credible and may help us to believe that there is definitely something coming our way after our last breath. But many people don't seem to really believe or care about this whole thing, nor is there a feeling of re-energizing one's relationship within the Church, and bring about a change of heart or a change of direction. ## Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 19, 2023 - Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles." "You have heard it said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brother only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same?"

### Commentary:

Jesus asks his followers to live by a higher law than the Mosaic code, replacing strict justice with deep concern for the welfare of others. Christians must rise above an ordinary human standard that says we love those who love us in return. Christianity challenges us to love our enemies. Jesus calls us to follow his example. His life mirrors God's love for all creation. We are to love not because others deserve love but because as Christians—followers of Christ, sons and daughters of God—it's our nature to love.

### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?



### **Pro-Life Corner: What to do if you have an unplanned pregnancy -7 coping strategies (from Psych Central).**

**"5. Consider support options.** Now may be a good time for you to figure who you can lean on for support. Your partner? Close friends? Family members? Or maybe you feel better speaking to a counselor about what you're thinking and feeling. No matter who you lean on, support should be unbiased and nonjudgmental. You deserve that. No one should judge you, your feelings, ... You may also consider seeking a doula or midwife near that can help you during this time.

**6. Visualize your options.** As you process your emotions, you may find really considering your options beneficial. You can try to visualize the following: what will life with a new baby at home be like, changes to routine, and so on, acknowledging both the good and bad; what will the adoption process be like should you decide to go down that path,..."

### Native American People

In the U.S. , there are approximately **6.79 million** Native American people—about 2% of the total. *US Census Bureau*

**33% of Native Americans live on reservations**, with another **26% living in counties surrounding tribal areas.** *US Dept. of Housing and Urban Development*

**The vast majority of land on reservations is held communally.** This means residents can't get clear title to the land where their home **sits** and one reason for the abundance of mobile homes on reservations.

This makes it hard for native Americans to establish credit and borrow money to improve their homes because they can't use the land as collateral. *Forbes* Native Americans have the **highest poverty rate** among all minority groups. The national poverty rate for Native Americans is **25.4%**. *US Census Bureau* The **unemployment rate for Native Americans is 6.1%**, whereas the national unemployment rate is 3.5%. *Bureau of Labor Statistics*

The **median income of American Indian and Alaskan Native households is \$43, 825**—substantially lower than average of US household income of \$87, 864. *World Population Review*

**Home ownership rates for Native Americans is 50.8%**—substantially lower than the US rate of 66%. *US Census Bureau*

**26.4% of Native people live without health insurance** coverage, compared to 8.6% for all Americans. *Center for Disease Control*

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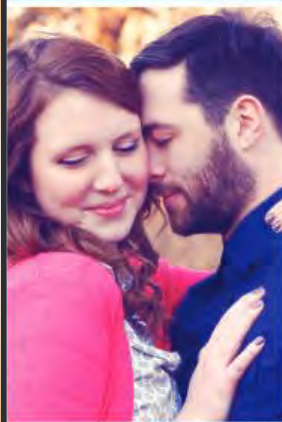


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
