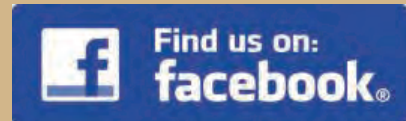

## From the Pastor's Desk

### My Mom

Dear Parishioners,

My father died suddenly of a massive heart attack in 1995. Subsequently, I began to travel on a regular basis with my mother. Being her only *unmarried* child (I have three brothers and a sister), it was easiest for me to accompany her to different vacation destinations over the last quarter of a century. At times to her friends she has affectionately referred to me as her "social director."

My mother is a rather private person. She would never want me to say anything about her let alone write something about her. I guess that I truly admire her interior strength and fortitude over the years. Not only did she give birth to and raise five children, but she helped my father run their own businesses (grocery store and butcher shop, hotel and restaurant, motel) while battling some major health issues over the years (thyroid surgery, gall bladder surgery, back surgery, breast cancer, atrial fibrillation, to name a few). And she has lived as a widow now for almost 28 years.

I have journeyed with her all over the country and the world. We've been on cruises (Alaska, Caribbean) and religious pilgrimages (Rome, Holy Land). She never wanted to repeat any destination if she can help it. For her, the world has too many other places to see!

Why bother telling all this to you? Simply because I love my mother as I hope that you all do. As priests we are no more or no less human than anyone else. We come from a family. We have various family responsibilities depending on our particular situations. We are somebody's child. The mother who gave me life deserves at least some of my time and attention. This was one way I have been able to spend some quality time with her through the years.

(As an aside, I am truly disgusted and saddened with the *woke* mentality in our contemporary society where mothers are referred to as "birthing persons" and even someone who now sits on the Supreme Court of our country couldn't/wouldn't clearly define what a *woman* is in her approval hearing. The world is insane!) So as I write today. I am preparing to wish my own mom a **Happy Mother's Day!** This November, with God's grace, she will reach her 90th birthday. Thank you God! Thanks so much for her! Additionally, I wish a **Happy Mother's Day** to all mothers this weekend.

For most people there is a *special bond* between mother and child. Our mothers carry us in their wombs for nine months. They endure the pangs of birth. They feed us, bathe us, clean up after us, teach us, comfort us, caress us and, most importantly, *love us*. How often they are *willing to sacrifice* for us! Thanks *moms* for your strength, patience and ability to make things better by your calming and reassuring presence. Whenever we take you for granted or forget what you have done for us over the years, we apologize. You deserve better from us. ***We love you!***

Those who have lost their earthly mothers, please remember to pray for them and have Masses offered for them. Our faith teaches us, whether they are in purgatory or in heaven, they can pray for us! Let's aid them in getting to heaven by offering our prayers, Masses and sacrifices for them.

In addition to our biological (or adoptive) mothers, I think that it is also important to remember to honor our *Spiritual Mother* as well. Our Blessed Lady should play an essential role in the lives of Catholics and indeed all Christians. She was given to us as our mother through St. John at the foot of the cross (See John 19: 26-27). After all, May is *her* month!

In the gospel of today, the sixth Sunday of Easter, as we draw closer to the Solemnity of Pentecost, Jesus tells us; “And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, **“whom the world cannot accept.”** Even

in Jesus’ time people just did not get it. We are referring to people not getting the meaning of our Faith, even those who we would describe as cradle Catholic. It is important that we don’t stop just at our moment in history, but remember that Jesus himself was not accepted in his days and by his own religious leaders who condemned him basically out of envy and jealousy. They felt threatened by Him, his words and his actions. Many among our own Catholics feel the same. They feel threatened by Jesus’ demands and feel that their own way is easier and fits them better. They are unable to see beyond their own thoughts and imagination. All of us can fall into this mode whereby we know better than GOD himself and Jesus and the saints. We become uninspired by the spiritual relevance in our life and so we live a distorted life, Of course, we don’t think so or we aren’t able to acknowledge it and thus GRACE and the gifts of the SPIRIT can’t bear fruit in us. We have a great responsibility to help our children not to fall in this trap. We need to respect their SOUL, the fact that GRACE is still pure in them and we need to FAN IT. We are responsible before GOD. There are those who say that “it is my child or my children and I do whatever I feel is best for them! Leaving God totally out of the picture. Then only Prayer on the part of those who believe, may help them find their way back. Some great places for children to learn about GOD. 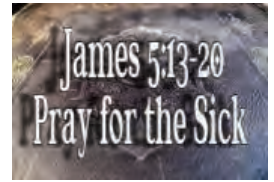

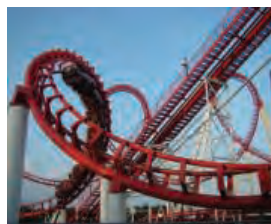

## SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER, MAY 14, 2023

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences

### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Seventh Sunday of Easter, May 21, 2023- John 17:1-11

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him. Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ. I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began."

### Commentary:

When Jesus ascended into heaven, for a moment it must have seemed like the world's saddest day. To have Jesus as your constant companion and friend, only to lose him from view - what could it have been like? Thank heaven the angels appeared and told the disciples to get a grip. Forget attachment to changeable emotions that dart like fish here and there. Hadn't they had enough of that during the long seven days we now call Holy Week? Stop grasping at this day or that hour as if it's the one that gives life meaning or contains the whole truth and nothing but the truth. Jesus didn't come into this world to offer us the tragedy of Good Friday to mourn or the victory of Easter to celebrate. Jesus brought eternity into time, so that we could climb out of time ourselves and be united with him in everlasting life. If the church calendar does anything, it assists us in detaching ourselves from chasing the years and invites us to consider never-ending realities. Knowing Jesus Christ is the first step we take on the threshold of eternity.

### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



### **Pro-Life Corner: Healthy Lifestyle "Pregnancy week by week" -Mayo Clinic**

"Some research suggests that depressive episodes occur more frequently during the first and third trimesters.

If you have untreated depression, you might not seek optimal prenatal care, eat the healthy foods your baby needs, or have the energy to care for yourself. You are also at increased risk of postpartum depression and having difficulty bonding with your baby.

Depending on the severity of your depression, treatment options might include psychotherapy or antidepressants in addition to psychotherapy.

The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists recommends that healthcare providers screen for depression and anxiety using a standardized tool at least once during pregnancy. During screening, your healthcare provider will likely ask questions from a standardized screening questionnaire, which consists of questions about mood and anxiety. Your answers are scored and your total score can be used to identify whether you have depression.

Alternatively, your healthcare provider might ask you if, in the past month, you have been bothered by feeling down, depressed or hopeless or by having little interest in doing things.
