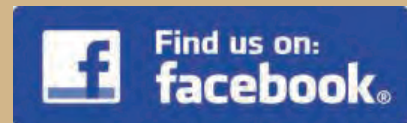

From the Pastor's Desk
God's Children are Not for Sale

Dear Parishioners,

Chances are you may be familiar with the actor **Jim Caviezel**. He most notably played **Jesus** in the movie *The Passion of the Christ*.

However, you may be less familiar with **Tim Ballard**. Tim formerly worked as a special agent for the **U.S. Department of Homeland Security**, but then quit his job there to pursue the rescue of children who are being trafficked in the sex trade worldwide. The organization that he formed is called **Operation Underground Railroad** about which the movie *Sound of Freedom* was written.

I saw the movie a few weeks ago and I highly recommend it. The plot surrounds an actual rescue of children that took place in Colombia, South America. The movie respectfully handles a most difficult subject and attempts to make people aware of the extent of human trafficking worldwide and, in particular, the sex trafficking of minors.

I have listened extensively to the interviews of both Jim and Tim on many varying platforms. To hear their personal stories and the background information of the film makes one aware of the evil and the dark forces that do not want this film to be successful or their message about human trafficking to get out to the general public. *Just shut up!*

The film did not get the backing of any of the normal Hollywood channels and was produced independently by **Angel Studios**, the same studio that has successfully produced the *Netflix* series, *The Chosen*. When I began to notice how much the mainstream media and the Hollywood elites continually try to portray the film, the actors, the subject matter, etc. in the most negative of terms, attached to all sorts of conspiracy theories, I suspect that the makers of the film have touched upon a much-hidden and carefully-protected sore spot among societal elites and various potential predators. Does anyone happen to remember *Harvey*, *Cosby*, *Spacey*, the *Me Too* movement, *Ghislaine*, *Jeffery* and his notorious island, etc. etc.? Or are our collective memories that bad?

When the filmmakers contend that **America** is the number one consumer of child pornography and that the money generated annually by the sex trafficking of minors and adults is a 150 billion dollar industry, does that bother us?

Remember we live in a culture where the destruction of preborn children is routine, where the sexualization of young children and adolescents is ever more commonplace, where the family unit has disintegrated, where sexual perversion and taboos are advocated and glorified, where pornography is rampant and where the moral compass of the godless does not exist. To quote the line from the Louis Armstrong song: *What a wonderful world!*

I have stated many times that God is in charge and that nothing happens without His knowing it or permitting it. However, biblical history has shown that things will only spiral out of control for so long without God's intervention. Remember Noah? How about Sodom and Gomorrah? What about the ten plagues of Egypt?

Then there was the great Roman Empire. I suspect that no one at the time would have predicted its demise.

I am thankful that there are people in the world who are willing to stand up for what is right and good despite the personal cost. I personally think that Jim Caviezel and Tim Ballard fit into this category. While none of us is perfect and without our own sin, we all need to take some responsibility for the sins of our society. And we need to stand up for and protect our most vulnerable members including the preborn, children, the handicapped, the infirm and the elderly.

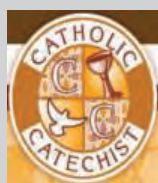
I especially echo the theme of *Sound of Freedom*: **God's Children are Not for sale!**

**What is World Youth Day? (WYD)
Preparing for a great event with Pope FRANCIS**

The World Youth Day (WYD) is an encounter of young people from around the world with the Pope, typically celebrated every three years. This event

allows them to experience the universality of the Church and to share their faith in Jesus Christ. This year, this great international gathering will be in Lisbon, Portugal, August 1st-6th.

Pope Francis, on Sunday, after the “Angelus”, at St. Peter Square, said: “There, in Lisbon, I am now enrolled as a pilgrim to World Youth Day.” And he invited young people around the world to “live this event of Grace and Fraternity with faith and enthusiasm, either by going to Lisbon or by participating in their communities”. (Our diocese of Camden has a youth group of young people preparing to attend this important gathering in Lisbon).

Let us be united with the Pope and with these courageous young people that are about to start this pilgrimage toward Lisbon that they may have a deep encounter with Christ and a renewed sense of their journey in their desire of being true disciples of Jesus, whatever vocation and mission He is calling them to fully live it.

Eucharistic Adoration

The Adoration of the Holy Eucharist, or Eucharistic Adoration, is an opportunity for the faithful to pray to Jesus Christ before the Eucharist at their local parish. The term “the faithful” refers to Catholics who wish to express and deepen their love of

Christ. But what makes praying during Eucharistic Adoration any different than the prayers you say throughout your daily life?

True, you can pray to God anywhere. *God is omnipresent, which means He is everywhere at all times.* As the Word of God [says in Proverbs 15:3](#), “The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good.” God is always near, and thus, you can always enter into His presence in prayer.

God is also omniscient, which means He knows everything, including your thoughts. King David [says in Psalm 139:1-4](#), “Lord, You have probed me, you know me: You know when I sit and stand; You understand my thoughts from afar. You sift through my travels and my rest; with all my ways You are familiar. Even before a word is on my tongue, Lord, You know it all.”

God’s omnipresence and omniscience are both wonderful truths that Catholics can take comfort in every day, whether at home, work or worshipping at your local parish. *But Eucharistic Adoration differs from your daily prayers in one key aspect. Catholics believe the body, blood, soul and divinity are substantially present in the Eucharist. In other words, when you participate in Eucharistic Adoration, you pray and worship Jesus in a more intimate, present and real way. Adoration is held in the Chapel Monday—Friday after the 9:00 AM Mass. All are welcome to spend some time with the Lord.*

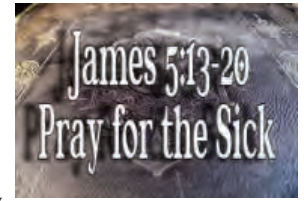

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6, 2023 - Matt. 17:1-9

Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrate and were very much afraid. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Rise, and do not be afraid." And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone. As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them, "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

Commentary:

The Apostles were having trouble understanding Jesus' prediction of his passion. They just couldn't get it. Jesus was transfigured before them and his "face shone like the sun." Moses and Elijah appeared and talked to Jesus about his Passover and passion. Then God the Father spoke from a bright cloud. All this surprised and frightened the disciples. Jesus touched them and comforted them. Jesus is available to us to help us understand his will for us so we can truly follow him. The Transfiguration is also the 4th Luminous Mystery of the Rosary; meditating on this mystery can help us follow God's will.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

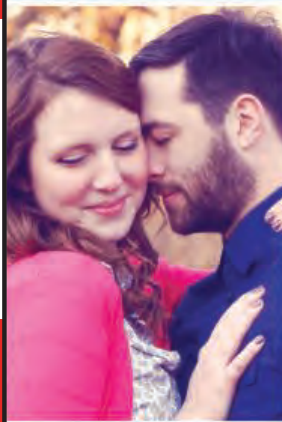
