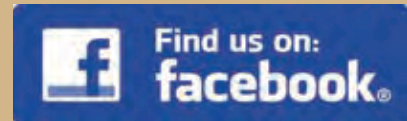

### Stewardship Corner: Epiphany of the Lord January 3, 2021

*“..they fell down and worshipped Him. Then they opened their treasures and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh...” - MATTHEW 2:11*

Notice the order of events in the Magi’s visit. First, they knelt before Jesus and prayed to Him. Then they presented Him with their gifts. We, too, as **Stewards**, must take time to pray before we present our gifts to the Lord. We never know what God may be asking us to share!

## From the Pastor's Desk



### The Epiphany

Dear Parishioners,

*We three kings of Orient are,  
Bearing gifts we traverse afar.*

As far as I can remember, this popular carol, referring to the **three kings from the East**, has been sung annually during the Christmas season. The carol itself was written in the 19<sup>th</sup> century by the Rev. John Henry Hopkins, Jr., an Episcopalian clergyman. Popular folklore has grown over the years regarding them, although the Sacred Scriptures dedicates only twelve verses to them in *St. Matthew's Gospel* (Mt. 2: 1-12).

First of all they are called *magi* in the Bible—not kings. Speculation has it that they were *astrologers*, although the term itself sometimes refers to a *magician* or a *Zoroastrian priest*. In any case, they were observing a **star** in their pursuit of the newborn King of the Jews. There is no mention that there are actually three of them, but the number of gifts seems to lead people to draw that conclusion.

With time the *magi* have been given names—*Caspar (Kaspar), Melchior and Balthazar*—although there is no biblical basis for this either. We are told that they brought three special gifts to the Christ Child—each seemingly with a unique significance: *gold, frankincense and myrrh*. While there are varied interpretations of the meaning of these gifts, *gold* is usually seen as a royal tribute paid to a king, *frankincense* as a sign of divinity and *myrrh* as an embalming oil as a symbol of death or, perhaps, healing.

What is the spiritual significance of this event known as the *Epiphany*? According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*:

**In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning toward the Jews and receiving from them the Messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament.** (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, # 528)

In Spain, the Philippines and various other countries throughout the Spanish-speaking world, various traditions have sprung up surrounding the *Three Kings* with forms of *gift-giving* attached. In a European tradition, the initials of the king's names are marked in chalk above the doors of homes (for example, *C+M+B+2021* or *K+M+B+2021*) as a blessing for the New Year. Other cultures celebrate the kings with a special *ring cake* concealing a figure of the baby Jesus inside.

No matter what traditions surround the celebration of the *Epiphany*, we need to always remember that **Jesus Christ is King!**

*O come let us adore Him!*

#### PRAYER FOR THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH



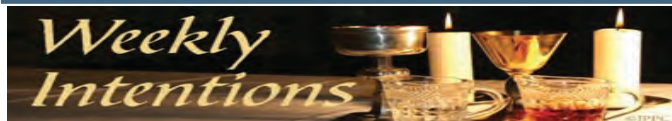

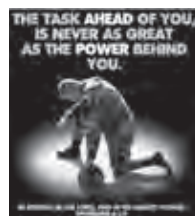
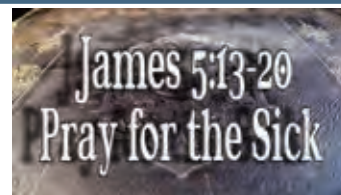

## EPIPHANY OF THE LORD, JANUARY 3, 2021

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for The Baptism of the Lord, January 10, 2021—Mark 1: 7-11

Jesus...was baptized in the Jordan by John. On coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit, like a dove, descending upon Him. And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

#### Commentary:

Our Christmas season comes to an end with Jesus' Baptism, and Ordinary Time begins as Jesus takes up His saving mission and ministry. This transition is marked by God' confirming voice. Today, we are called to remember that we, too, are called and sent by God to share the Good News, share God's love with all. It is our mission to share this love, rooted in God's word to you also: "*You are my beloved; with you I am well pleased.*"

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. When, where, and why were you baptized? How has Baptism made a difference in the way you live your life?
2. Recall a time when you began a new role or position in life. How did you experience God's blessing on you? On God being present and loving to you?
3. How does God's expression, "My beloved," impact you and the relationship you and God have? What is your response to this loving expression?

#### The Clothing Industry and Child Labor

The clothing we wear, especially the [demand for "fast fashion,"](#) has an unseen price on the lives of the workers and on the environment. In the effort to produce clothes more cheaply and quickly, companies often turn to workers in underdeveloped nations, where they are paid unfair wages and may work in slave-like conditions that contribute to the cycle of poverty. The 2018 Stop Child Labor Coalition estimated that there are nearly 200 million child laborers throughout the world. The average American now generates 82 pounds of textile waste each year. Even keeping clothing for 9 months longer reduces the carbon footprint for that garment by 30%

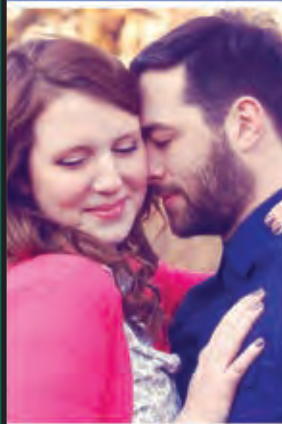
