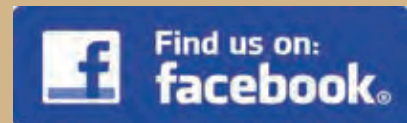

## From the Pastor's Desk

### “Lord, Will Only a Few People Be Saved?”

Dear Parishioners,

People do not like to hear doom and gloom all of the time. To be quite frank, it gets rather depressing. I know I tend to avoid people who are continually negative and critical. I prefer to associate with those who are upbeat, positive and optimistic.

Then I ask myself this question: *Where does one draw the line between being **negative and critical** and being **realistic and honest**?* I think that I especially struggle with this dilemma when trying to analyze our contemporary society in the context of Gospel values, Christ's teaching and long-standing Catholic tradition. I keep seeing just how far we have allowed ourselves to deviate from Christ as a society and even within the Church itself.

For instance, consider the contemporary attitudes towards *divorce and remarriage, birth control* (artificial contraception), *homosexual unions* (“gay” marriage), *gender identity, abortion / infanticide, IVF* (in-vitro fertilization), *assisted suicide, pornography, cohabitation* before and outside of marriage, *sex outside of marriage* (fornication, adultery, masturbation, homosexual acts, etc.) and various other matters. The list of what has become, at a minimum, **tolerated** if not outright **advocated** seems endless. I genuinely cannot wrap my head around it all.

Then I look within the Catholic Church and see the lack of belief / reverence for the Holy Eucharist, only one-fifth of registered Catholics going to Mass each week (pre-pandemic), a decline in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, the merging and closing of parishes and churches, scandals in the clergy and the hierarchy, an attitude of **indifferentism** (one religion is as good as another), *progressive* liturgies, etc., and my head is ready to explode. *Where is it all going?*

There are those who contend that we live in a time of great **apostasy**—an abandonment of the faith, a rejection of Christ. Maybe most people do not *outright* reject Christ or Catholicism—although an alarming amount do—but far too many live in such a way that the Church and her traditional teaching have little or no influence on the way a person lives his or her life. Moral teaching becomes relative and subjective. Truth is fluid. Confusion is rampant. I can see it happening among family members and friends. I can see it in parish life. I can see it in society and even in the worldwide Church.

**“Lord, will only a few people be saved?” [Jesus] answered them, “Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough.”** (Lk. 13: 24)

The words of Jesus in the Gospel (Lk. 13: 22-30) speak of the *narrow gate*. I see it as a warning not to follow the *status quo* but to be *counter-cultural*. Many today think that God will not or could not condemn vast numbers of people to eternal punishment. *How could so many people be wrong? Maybe the Church and her teaching need to change!*

**Rather, I think WE need to change and return to the Lord with repentant hearts before it is too late!**

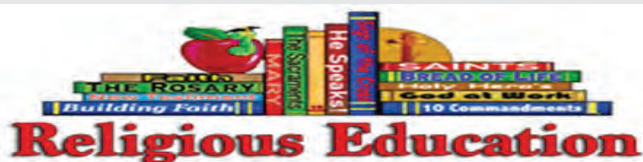
Eternity is forever. The stakes are much too high to gamble with salvation.

The Scripture Readings for this Sunday are so rich in meaning and significance for our life in this January 2021. Yet the one connecting thread seems to be that “we can’t just accept to be alive, keep on doing the routine thing”. These are not times to just wait for life to happen or for “a resigned spirit”. Absolutely NOT!

The people of Nineveh accepted the challenge that God was giving to them through Jonah and thus they LIVED! The NT reading seems to be saying that the world or life we have known is gone. We are the builders of a new life a new future, a new world. WE ARE. The Gospel Reading presents the calling of the first disciples who, once they experienced the call, they left all things and followed JESUS. Our lives may have a less challenging radicality, but nonetheless we are called to renew our lives and live. There is life after COVID19, after all our contemporary story. THERE IS A FUTURE OF OUR MAKING, WITH THE HELP OF GOD. May we rise to the challenge like the NINEVITES and the DISCIPLES did. Our example is indispensable for our children to raise them in FAITH IN GOD, hope, love, courage, bravery.

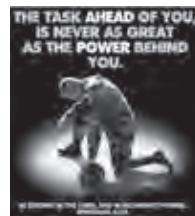
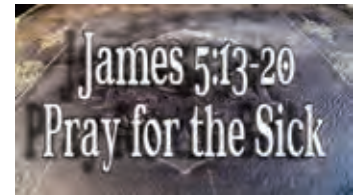

## THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, JANUARY 24, 2021

**Small Christian Community Faith Sharing** Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 31, 2021 - Mark 1:21-28

Then they came to the Capernaum, and on the Sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at His teaching, for He taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are - the Holy One of God. Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching authority? He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey Him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

### Commentary:

The most important question Mark's Gospel asks is "Who is Jesus?" Jesus taught with authority. Jesus' presence changed situations. Jesus' actions matched his words. The scribes were another story. They knew well the Hebrew Scriptures. They were learned men. **However, their words were empty because their actions did not match their words. They did not live what they preached. For us, it is important to live what we preach. Then our teaching will be in accord with God's Will.**

### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

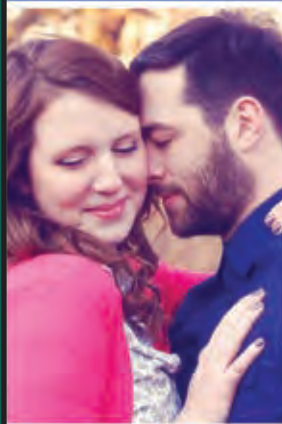
