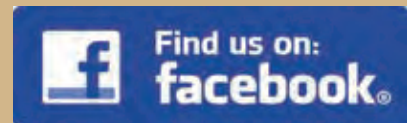

From the Pastor's Desk

Let the Healing Begin

Dear Parishioners,

Let me get this over with quickly. Sometimes it's hard for us all to admit our faults and failings to others.

However, I hereby admit that at times . . .

. . . I can be stubborn.

. . . I can be selfish.

. . . I can criticize others.

. . . My sense of humor can, at times, be sarcastic and biting.

. . . I struggle with prayer.

. . . I am not as generous as I probably should be.

Need I go on? This could develop into a pretty big list if I let it. Only my *confessor* knows all the details. Yes, I do go to confession . . . *regularly*.

The beginning step in any *healing* process, I think, is *being right with God*. I base this on the story of Jesus' healing of the paralytic. (See Mk. 2: 1-12; Mt. 9:1-8; or Lk. 5:17-26) Before He began any type of physical healing on the paralytic, Jesus first forgave him—healing before the physical healing. That's why I continue to sing the praises of regular, integral confession in which sins are forgiven—*spiritual healing* takes place.

I am no fraudulent faith healer. You won't find me peddling any snake oil either. Do I believe that *Jesus* can heal? Absolutely. I think that He (through His *apostolic* Church) gave us sacraments of healing like *Penance and Reconciliation* and *Anointing of the Sick* for a reason. Sometimes the healing process involves overcoming our own pride and asking for help—admitting humbly that I cannot forgive or heal myself without God's grace. Forgiveness of sins is not something that can accurately be portrayed in some *self-help* book. We need the personal forgiveness of Christ which is offered to us freely in the sacraments of the Church. We can receive forgiveness of sins, anointing when we are seriously ill, the Holy Eucharist to fill the depths of our spiritual hungers, all completely free of charge upon asking!

Yet we must continue to do battle with those who will disagree and tell us how we are wrong:

Father, you don't have to go to a priest. You can confess directly to God.

Why should I pray? God doesn't answer my prayers.

I am too far gone. There's no hope for me at this point.

Religion is a bunch of nonsense and fairy tales. I'll take my chances.

These and arguments like them somehow seem to forget (or may never have known) the personal relationship that Jesus desires for all of us, which continues to be present through His Mystical Body, the Church. Christ (a Divine Person) became a man, a human being, with both a human and divine nature. God became incarnate and continues to use flesh and blood people like us to further His mission and to carry out His will.

Do this in memory of me (Lk. 22:19) . . . Whose sins you shall forgive are forgiven them (Jn. 20:23) . . . Go and baptize them (Mt. 28:19) . . . Do these commands of Jesus seem to imply that we should do it entirely by ourselves? Is it just a situation of "*me and God?*" Rather, is Jesus not trying to spread His mission and His message far and wide? Is He not continually trying to bring healing and forgiveness to a wounded world through His Church?

Please take advantage of the **Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation**. Multiple opportunities are available for you to *let the healing begin*. Put aside the pride, humble yourself, and let Jesus into your heart. *You will not regret it.*

This time away from the regular classroom setting has made us appreciate a few things.

- The importance of human contact**
- The value of interaction in person**
- The possibility of constant self-evaluation**
- The need to share our faith in the wider community.**

We have had all our regular classes and meetings via GOOGLE MEET or ZOOM, and yes, these are better than nothing. But they never can make up for the values of the personal interaction, of learning in person. Yes, there are those who think that religious education formation should be the responsibility of parents. True, and no one can change that either. It all starts there, in the home, in the family. But it does not stop there. The parish's responsibility cannot be underestimated or substituted either. The old mentality that "parents drop children off for catechism and pick them up" and that is all, never should have been or be today. Parents need to teach their children by example, by words, by actions and yes, also by sitting down with the religion book or technology available, and work with the child or children, continuing or completing the catechism lesson at the parish. I do remember growing up and our MOM sitting the four of us on the kitchen bench and asking us the catechism questions. We had to study, memorize each week for our catechism class. And we also prayed as a family daily, and no one questioned about going to Mass on Sunday. It was a given, it was the thing the family did every Sunday and holy days.

In today's gospel, everyone in the synagogue (church today) was amazed at the way JESUS taught because he did so with Authority. His words meant something; they made a difference. His presence, fascinated them and even the unclean spirit admitted so. What if, parents and catechists would so astound the children in teaching that they would reveal the presence of JESUS? What if, from our teaching, the children too could say: "We know who you are, the Holy One of GOD". Jesus is waiting for us to be able to tell us: "You are mine, listen to my voice, and understand what "IT" can mean for your life."

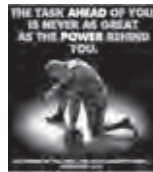
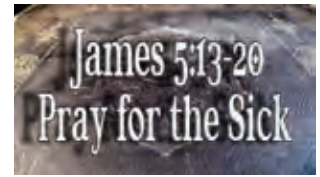

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 7, 2021- Mark 1:29-39

Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever...He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them...He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons...Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed..."Let us go to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come."

Commentary:

Jesus' ministry cannot be contained. The healing that begins with one woman expands to "all who were ill"; what begins in one home reaches out to the "whole town" and indeed, to "the whole of Galilee." The ministry and preaching of Jesus continues to expand through the proclamation of the gospel, the ministry of the disciples, and the work of the Church. As members of Christ's body (the Church), therefore, it is also our work to preach the gospel and reach out to all those who need healing.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

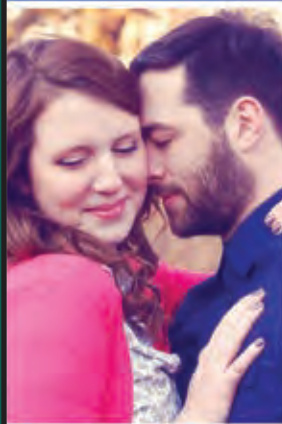
