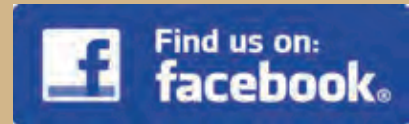

From the Pastor's Desk

Getting Ready for Lent

Dear Parishioners,

Consider me strange, but I am actually looking forward to the beginning of **Lent**. I see it as a special time to be *introspective*, to think about where I am right now in my relationship with Jesus, and to attempt to make some positive changes that I hope will result in a growth in holiness.

Traditionally, the practices recommended during this season are **prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charity)**.

How can I **pray better**? I can begin by *finding* and *keeping* a set time each day to pray. (My own preference is praying in the presence of the **Blessed Sacrament**.) I also should be reading and reflecting daily on the *Sacred Scriptures*, praying the *Rosary*, making the *Stations of the Cross* and reading an inspiring Catholic book *regularly*. When I am driving in the car, if I do not take advantage of some quiet, I like to put on an informative or uplifting Catholic talk or discussion to listen to while driving. It certainly beats the garbage that we often find on the radio.

Fasting includes *food* but should go beyond simply *not eating*. The only two fast days (one simple meal) required by the Church during Lent are *Ash Wednesday* and *Good Friday*. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are also days of *abstinence* (no meat). However, we can also fast from things like the TV, the computer/internet, video games, the radio, from smoking or drinking, from superfluous shopping, etc. In essence, we can do *without*—make an act of *self-denial*—and try to incorporate into our lives something more spiritually beneficial.

How **charitable** am I? Do I regularly contribute to and support my church? Do I have some other favorite charity to which I give? Do I volunteer my time or my skills to help others *without seeking compensation or recognition*? Do I call (or visit?) the sick or the elderly when possible? Do I think of *others* more than myself?

The practices that I observe for Lent can really become an opportunity to change my way of living. I can incorporate more permanently various ways of behaving that open my heart and my life more completely to God. I can turn my life over to **Jesus** and *take up my cross daily* and *follow Him*. (See Luke 9:23)

I realize that *I am a sinner* continually in need of the *mercy of God*. Like all humans (except Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mary, of course!), my life has not been without sin. I am not proud of this. Therefore, I should seriously consider some acts of penance during Lent in reparation for my sins. Making a thorough, heartfelt *sacramental confession* is a good way to start.

We should be spiritually mature enough to realize that the more we keep trying and letting God control our lives, the more we open ourselves to His grace of *conversion*. **Conversion** is a lifelong process of turning *away from sin* and turning *towards the Gospel message*.

On Ash Wednesday, when the ashes are sprinkled on our heads (yes, there is another change this year), do we actually intend *to change*, or is this just an act of *empty show*? Only God knows what's in our hearts and how much we really do love Him. Please make this **Lent** a time of deep, spiritual conversion.

The educational approaches have changed dramatically in the past 20 years or so. Technology has affirmed itself as an active contender in our efforts to form our children in the FAITH. If we want to make a difference in our children's life of FAITH, we need to go with the flow of this innovative venture which seems to be screaming: "I am here to stay, not to go away". The series of books we use in our catechetical program are "CHRIST IN US" and Dynamic Catholic. These have remarkable features for children, Catechists and Parents. Things indeed have and are changing to adapt to the world we are presently living in. Yet, some things have not and will not change. Parents are still the primary educators and formators of their children. Families are the vital cells of society and of the Catholic Church. Parish assistance is indispensable to promote and provide sound FAITH formation for all.

This Sunday's readings all point to the Liturgical Season of LENT, which is beginning this week with ASH Wednesday. How do we present LENT to our children/YOUTH? Perhaps we may start with some positive analogies we have known and can readily be understood. In Lent we have a chance for some spring cleaning of our life. What may be some things that need to change in ME? What are some things I should be doing that I am not doing? What are some attitudes that need attention in my life? What meaningful sacrifices can help me to live a more virtuous life?

Here is a little story as an example. A few years ago, a mom told me that her sons went home after catechism class and decided together that they needed to clean up their room and make their beds every morning as their sacrifice for LENT. It was a way to please MOM. I knew the family well and thus, years later, when I met one of the sons, I asked him if he still made his bed every day. He answered that he never stopped. He is now getting ready to go to college, and it came spontaneously to me to say, "Brandon, you are ready for college."

We remember the three themes of a penitential time: **prayer, fasting, almsgiving**. Plan with the family how these may become real by working together on some concrete activities .or goals.

Lenten Regulations

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence from meat. There is a limit of one full meal on these days for all **between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive.**

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat.

All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain from meat.

There is no obligation to fast on weekdays of Lent, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Easter Duty Obligation

After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season.

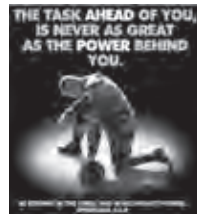
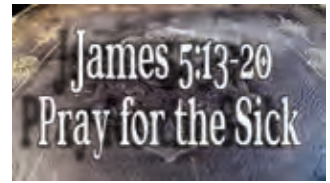

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent, February 20, 2021 - Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Commentary:

On this first Sunday of Lent, we hear Mark's version of Jesus being tempted in the desert. Jesus begins with this confrontation with evil. The rest of his life and work will continue this great battle: casting out demons, healing, struggling for the truth against corrupt leaders and even the blindness of his own disciples. Through it all, he proclaims the good news that the time of God's reign is now. God's truth and love is stronger than distortion and injustice. Believe the good news and it can change your life.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

Black History Month

Augustine Tolton, was the first Roman Catholic priest in the United States publicly known to be black when he was ordained in 1886.

A former slave who was baptized and reared Catholic, Tolton studied formally in Rome. Father Peter McGirr, an Irish immigrant priest, encouraged Augustine's studying in Rome after he was rejected by all Seminaries in the U.S. He was ordained there on Easter Sunday of 1886 at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran.

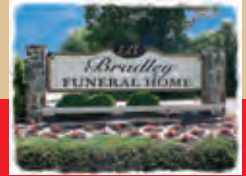
