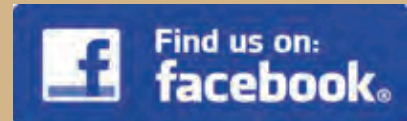

From the Pastor's Desk



Laetare Sunday

Dear Parishioners,

The 4th Sunday of Lent is traditionally known as *Laetare Sunday*. The day's theme comes from the entrance antiphon reflecting on **Isaiah 66: 10-11**: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast." *Laetare* means "rejoice" and like its counterpart in Advent, *Gaudete* Sunday, the priest has the option of wearing rose-colored vestments instead of violet. The change of color is supposed to indicate a sense of hope and joy--an anticipation of Easter--in the midst of the penitential season. We are now only 21 days away from Easter Sunday!

The Gospel today (Year B) contains a much referred to Bible verse (**John 3:16**), which I can remember looking up as a teenager after I saw people holding up signs with this verse referenced on them at football games:

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. (Jn. 3:16)

I suggest that we take some time to reflect on the power of this single verse from Scripture. It is the core of the Christian message. Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus here, a leading Pharisee of the time, who came to question Jesus at night. I like to call him *Nick at Night*. He was most likely *afraid* to be associating with Jesus openly because of what his fellow Pharisees and others might think.

Billy Graham, the famous evangelical preacher who was honored nationally three years ago at his funeral, often focused on the basic, simple truths of the Bible to let people know how much God loved them. He was direct, clear, and forceful in his approach to preaching the Gospel:

Make no mistake, though, Graham wrote messages ideal for the masses and for calling people to decision. In other words, to understate the obvious, he really knew how to preach an evangelistic sermon. Graham spoke of life and death, heaven and hell, repentance, society in decay, souls in misery, the love of God, the Cross of Christ. He majored in the gospel in a way simple and clear, relied on Scripture alone for his authority—repeating "the Bible says" without apology—and pursued the listener's heart and will from beginning to end. The title of his ministry's monthly magazine—*Decision*—testifies to this single-minded aim. His preaching displayed a galvanizing urgency because he asked the listener what they would do with Christ today. (**Craig Brian Larson**)

I contrast the Pharisee Nicodemus and his reluctance to accept and become a disciple of Jesus, with Billy Graham's sense of urgency and necessity about following Jesus. When we hear the words of Jesus, how do we respond? Do we have a sense of hesitancy and reluctance, or are we willing to respond, follow and change our lives? Each person, each generation must make this decision.

Yes, God loves us and sent His Son to us! His Son died for us. Being Jesus' disciple is a life-changing opportunity and offers us an eternal future with life and hope! This is indeed Good News! It is a reason to rejoice!

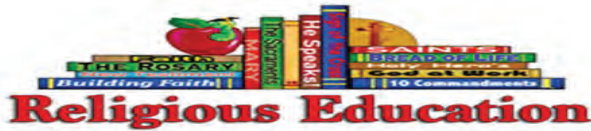

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed . . .” (They condemn themselves by refusing to believe) This quote from the Gospel of JOHN is described as the Kerygma. In brief: “it is the proclamation of GOD’S PLAN” for the world, to save it through JESUS.

This proclamation is for each of us, for God the Father sent JESUS in this world for each of us. It sounds so astonishing and mystical, not for the common ordinary person. But, in God’s standards, none of us is so ordinary as we are completely held by GOD’s Grace. The world is HOLY, it comes from the Will of GOD. Each person is inhabited by GOD. It is the actions of humanity that fill the world with sin. In educating and forming our children, this is the foundation they should have at the core of their being, the whole purpose for living: To know, love and serve God in this life and love and serve one another is not likely to change any time in the present or the future. We do have a choice, though, we can accept or refuse God’s purpose, but our choices do have consequences in this life and in eternity.

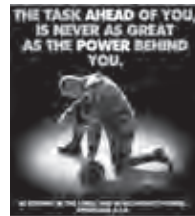
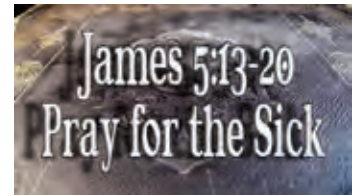

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21, 2021 - John 12:20-30

Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me."

Commentary:

In today's Gospel Jesus speaks of real resurrection. And he tells his followers that the only way to come to this life of glory is by dying. The image of the grain of wheat offers a powerful example of this reality. A single seed is limited and alone. But if the seed dies to its present state, it will grow into a stalk filled with seeds. The message for us is that the present is good, but because Christ has brought an end to death through his own death and resurrection, we can look forward to a future that will be far more than our limited lives here and now.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

Pope Francis in Iraq

The Pope prayed the Sunday Angelus on March 7 with Christians at a church in Bakhdida, a town 20 miles southeast of Mosul occupied by ISIS from 2014 to 2016.

"Our gathering here today shows that terrorism and death never have the last word. The last word belongs to God and to his Son, the conqueror of sin and death,"

Pope Francis said in the Syriac Catholic Immaculate Conception Church.

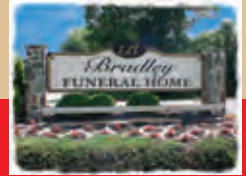
