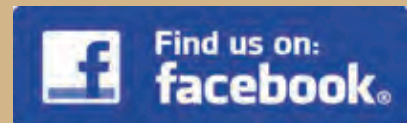

Stewardship Corner **5th Sunday of Lent** **Stewards are God’s People**

“I will be their God and they shall be my people.”
JEREMIAH 31:33

What does it mean to be God’s people? It means we recognize that everything we have and everything we are belongs to God. We aren’t “owners” of anything, we are merely “**Stewards**” of the gifts God has given us. It means we are willing to use our gifts and our lives to care for our family, our neighbors and for people we don’t know, just as God cares for each of us.

From the Pastor's Desk Various Levels of Introspection



Dear Parishioners,

Lent is meant to be a time of introspection. I have been practicing this myself and trying to improve my life as the Lord shows me my various faults and failings. I admit, honestly and sadly, I am a sinner in need of God's mercy. I am preparing for that day when I will appear before Almighty God in judgment *for what I have done and what I have failed to do*. St. Paul tells us,

“For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.” (2 Cor. 5:10)

Also, as I look at my role as pastor of **St. Thomas More Parish**, am I doing what I should do for the good of my parishioners? My primary concern is the *salvation of every immortal soul*. It is inevitable when I authentically preach the Gospel, it will strike a nerve in some people—especially if I point out something that is sinful and unacceptable to God. **“If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first. If you belonged to the world, the world would love its own; but because you do not belong to the world, and I have chosen you out of the world, the world hates you.”** (Jn.15: 18-19)

The *cancel culture* would want me silenced as may those who deem the Gospel irrelevant, outdated or offensive. I remind all that *truth* will remain *truth* no matter how unpopular it may be in a particular culture or at a specific time in history. The Gospel does not become irrelevant but remains the means of salvation for those who believe in it and follow it.

While there are things that I observe that may not be considered *deliberately* sinful, nevertheless there are some areas I can tell you I observe from my perspective *as pastor* on which we definitely can begin to improve.

Increased participation at Mass and the sacraments. I am fully aware of any previous and current restrictions that may be in effect. However, when it becomes an excuse to avoid Mass attendance for the young, healthy, etc., I fear many will simply not return to regular attendance even after restrictions are completely lifted. We still owe God worship and it is simply not the same *watching* Mass on TV or on a tablet, phone or computer. We cannot receive Holy Communion through the internet. Moreover, we should take advantage of the *Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation* frequently. This sacrament needs to take place *in person* and not remotely.

Reverence when receiving the Blessed Sacrament. I am upset with the manner in which Holy Communion may be received. During this time of wearing face masks, I have witnessed too frequently people fumble with their face masks while holding the Sacred Host and then sometimes dropping the host on the floor. This manner of handling the host will inevitably lead to particles of the host on the floor as well. I personally witness the many crumbs that are always on the paten in front of me on the altar when I purify the sacred vessels. How many particles wind up on the floor from the casual or irreverent manner the Sacred Host is handled? The face mask should be lowered before receiving Holy Communion. That is why the priest or *Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion* is wearing a face mask when distributing Holy Communion.

Avoiding distractions when in Church or at Mass. Please silence those cell phones. I realize that some may use them in place of missalettes, so I do not say shut them off at this time. However, they should not be ringing during Holy Mass. Also, unnecessary talking should not take place while people are trying to pray. Please take social conversations outside, when possible. Remember we are in the presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

While there are other things that may have to be mentioned at a later time, can we begin to look at these areas and discern whether or not they may be applicable to my own actions? Thank you for your consideration.

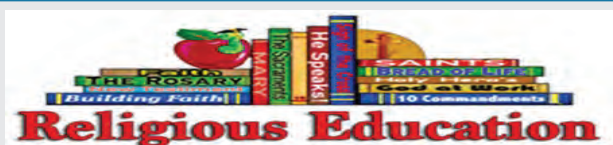

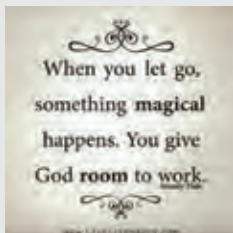

Working with the children we realize that some are like sponges, they soak the TRUTH in; they want to know more. But there are some with whom we sense a resistance. This is true of adults as well. It becomes hard to share the Gospel when we are confronted with RESISTANCE to it. As Catechists, teachers or parents, we find this a real challenge. What is resistance? It is a 'push back', a confrontational challenge, spoken and, many times, unspoken. This Sunday's first reading from **Jer . 31:31-34** is a very moving one, especially if we paraphrase it as if God was speaking directly to "ME" "*Behold the day is here when I wish to make a new covenant with you. It is a new covenant, like none before between us. I am placing my image in your heart, my law will be written there, I wish to be YOUR GOD, and I wish for YOU TO BE TOTALLY MINE. I remember nothing of the past disloyalties, All I wish is a new day, a new life, a new openness for YOU.*" It cannot be denied that this takes a courageous "YES" on our part, but also on GOD's part, as he entrusts HIMSELF to our lowly human nature. **Human resistance** comes into play in ways we can hardly figure out, and clever excuses come into play. We're honored to have God inviting us to such lofty aims, and for HIM to take care of situations for us. But to be His primary instrument is a different story. And yet, this is what being a CHRISTIAN means. It is the task of all adults around our children to help them rise to desire GOD as their primary FATHER, sustainer, defender, promoter, life-giver. We can say that there is a whole lot of RESISTANCE TO THIS IN OUR WORLD, church and each of us today.

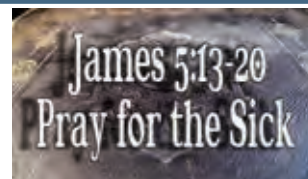

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Palm Sunday, March 28, 2021- Mark, Chapters 14 and 15

"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many..." {pause} "While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the high priest's maids came along. Seeing Peter warming himself, she looked intently at him and said, "You too were with the Nazarene, Jesus." But he denied it saying, "I neither know nor understand what you are talking about..." {pause} Pilate questioned Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus said to him in reply, "You say so."

Commentary:

Apostles, who should know who Jesus is, betray, deny, and flee. Ironically, it is from enemies and foreigners that we come to understand who Jesus is: the religious leaders ask Jesus if he is "the Christ, the Son of the Blessed One"; Pilate condemns him as the "king of the Jews"; the Roman centurion confesses that "Truly this man is the Son of God." As we stand this day at the foot of the cross, whom do we see?

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

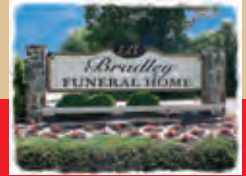
