## From the Pastor's Desk Holy Week Begins

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we begin the most sacred week of the year for Christians. We recall Christ's passion, death and resurrection. We are reminded of all that God has done for us in sending us His *Only Begotten Son*.

**Palm Sunday** recalls Jesus' triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem. His royal reception sees Him being lauded by the crowd: *Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest.* (Mt. 21:9) However, entering Jerusalem meant that Jesus was now ready to begin His bitter passion and to face death on a cross. The crowd quickly turned on Him as they chanted: *Let him be crucified! . . . Let him be crucified!* (Mt. 27: 22-23) We can see how quickly any *glory* and *honor* that the world may have for any of us can change to *ridicule*, *scorn* and even *hatred*.

On **Holy Thursday** (7:00 PM Mass) we recall the *Last Supper* where Jesus instituted the *Holy Eucharist* and the *Ministerial Priesthood*. Priesthood and the Holy Eucharist are intimately connected: without the Priesthood, there would be no Holy Eucharist. Jesus' actions also remind us of the call to service displayed by the *mandatum* or washing of the apostles' feet. ***Do you realize what I have done for you? You call me 'teacher' and 'master,' and rightly so, for indeed I am. If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do.*** (Jn. 13: 12-15) The *Blessed Sacrament* will remain in the repository in our chapel until 10 PM, where there is time for silent prayer and adoration.

The liturgy of the *Passion of the Lord* on **Good Friday** (3 PM Service) has 3 main components: a reading of the passion account from St. John's gospel followed by various intercessions, veneration of the cross and Holy Communion. Masses are not offered on Good Friday. In addition, the *Stations of the Cross* will be observed in the chapel at 7 PM. (This day remains a day of fast—one full meal—and abstinence from meat.)

The **Easter Vigil** (8 PM Mass) is not intended as a Mass to be rushed through quickly. (Please note: Mass usually lasts minimally about 2 - 2<sup>1/2</sup> hours.) There are so many beautiful parts that, if done reverently and properly, should not be hurried or omitted. We begin with a lighting of the Easter fire and a candlelight ceremony. Then follows the singing of the *Exultet* or Easter Proclamation. Salvation history is traced through a series of readings as the congregation is reminded of how God has continued to work in and through every age. After the readings comes the time to bring new members into the Catholic Church through *Baptism* and the reception of other *Sacraments of Initiation* (*Confirmation & Holy Communion*).

The Easter water is blessed at this time and sprinkled on the congregation as we renew our baptismal promises. Finally, Mass continues in normal fashion with the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*.

Please consider participation in these liturgies of the **Easter Triduum**. We all need to be reminded of what Christ has done for us. The little time that we might spend in Church pales in comparison to the hours that he suffered for us on the cross.

The Masses for **Easter Sunday** are at the usual times: 8:30 AM and 11 AM.

The Stations of the Cross also known as Via Crucis or Way of the Cross, is a devotion that has a long history, going back to the origins of Christianity in Jerusalem. Some ancient sources even say that Mary, Jesus' Mother, traced the steps from her home near Jerusalem to Calvary. Pilgrims visiting the Holy Land will definitely get to follow the Via Dolorosa (the Way of Sorrow), walking from the house of Pontius Pilate to Calvary, as Jesus did. While 2000 years ago the area was rural, today the "Via Dolorosa" is within the city, through neighborhoods which are not Christian, and reaches the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, where the original tomb of Jesus is still preserved. For the pilgrims, taking this journey can be quite an astounding thing. The Stations of the Cross are prayed on Good Friday through the streets of towns and cities across the world. In Rome the Holy Father usually participates in the Stations at the Colosseum. Thousands of people from all over the world participate, crowding the streets adjacent. EWTN does show them on Good Friday. Even though we are not there in person, sitting quietly in front of the TV and taking it all in can be moving. This devotion, when well organized and prayed with FAITH and union with JESUS, has the power to make us better understand the cost of HIS Sacrifice and cause us to move forward on our conversion of soul, mind and heart. As a Lenten practice, it helps us to recall that first Good Friday and bring us to the excitement JESUS' RESURRECTION.

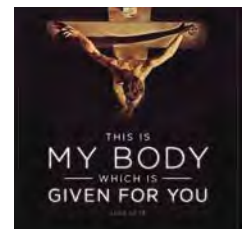
**There will be 2 collections in Holy Week.**



**Holy Thursday**, we will be taking up the **Poor and Needy Collection**. This collection benefits those in need in our parish areas.

**Good Friday**, we will be taking a collection for the **Holy Land**.

This collection assists Christians to remain in the Holy Land, including the poor and young couples, and builds thousands of residential units. Additionally, they build senior care facilities. Medical assistance is provided for the needy, among other ministries.



### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord, April 17, 2022 – John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed.

#### Commentary:

Mary Magdalene ran from the empty tomb to tell Peter and John the troubling news. In turn, Peter and John ran to see for themselves. That first Easter morning, everyone was in a great hurry to share the burden, to seek understanding, to see for themselves. Fast forward to today - if any of us is in a hurry, it may be only to get a decent parking place at church, or to get a seat at the local breakfast buffet. It's good to be reminded that the first Easter was a rush to comprehend an impossible event. We might spare a few moments in contemplation of what made a grieving woman hitch up her skirts and dash through the dark, or grown men race like boys to embrace the mystery.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



**Pro-Life Corner:** Would you be "pro-choice" if choice meant someone had a right to choose to kill you? It's actually pretty easy to be "pro-choice" as long as you're not the one being chosen to die. Babies have no choice and no voice in this matter. We must be their voice. Speak out in defense of life.
