#### From the Pastor's Desk

### **Why Catholics Continue to Have Hope**

Dear Parishioners,

As a Catholic priest I am charged with preaching the Gospel—the *Good News*. I can certainly point out all the things that are confusing or even scandalous in the Catholic Church. However, there are important reasons why true Catholics do not give up *hope* despite the many obstacles we face. We do not flee when the wolf attacks the sheep. We do not deny Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. We remain faithful even if everyone calls us ridiculous, stupid, or out of touch. Remember in the *Beatitudes* we are told that we are actually *blessed* when we are unjustly persecuted.

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you [falsely] because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven. Thus they persecuted the prophets who were before you. (Mt. 5: 11-12)

Opposition and persecution have been present from the beginning of the Church and continue to this day. Let me reflect with you on some of my reasons for ongoing *hope* within the Catholic Church:

- **Jesus is victorious over sin and death.** Jesus' suffering and death on the cross, rather than being a defeat, was a victory. Jesus rose from the dead. Death has no more power over Him. His Resurrection gives every Christian the hope of eternal life. While we have not yet seen the culmination of all of God's plans, we know *Who* has already won the victory. *Christus Vincit!*
- Jesus promised to remain with His Church. "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt. 28: 20) First, Jesus remains with us in the Holy Eucharist. We believe in His Real Presence on our altars and in our tabernacles. We also have the Sacred Scriptures to guide and inspire us. Through the ministerial priesthood Christ still acts in each sacrament. Christ remains with His Church whenever we gather in His name, but most especially at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
- Jesus told us that evil will not prevail. "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it." (Mt. 16: 18) Through the centuries, there have been bitter battles for the soul of the Church. We have seen many martyrs. We have had bad popes, bishops, priests, etc. Attempts have been made to destroy the Church from within and from without. Despite all such attempts, the Church remains. And it will remain.
- Our Lady continues to intercede for us, her children. Devotion to Our Blessed Mother is a *sine qua non* for any believing Catholic. I have been especially devoted to the apparitions of Fatima (Portugal) and to the other approved apparitions like Lourdes (France), Guadalupe (Mexico), etc. According to the seer Sr. Lucia, the message given at Fatima from Our Lady was "In the end my Immaculate Heart will triumph." When we pray the *Hail Mary*, we ask for Our Lady's intercession *now and at the hour of our death*. She was given to us at the foot of the cross to be our **spiritual mother**. She continues to intercede for her children and to care about their eternal salvation as any good mother would.

I continue to have hope. What is going on in the Church still concerns me tremendously. Yet, we need to remain faithful to the Lord as He is always faithful to us. If you have any doubts, look at the crucifix.

Those of us of a certain age have great memories of our month of May dedicated to Mary. We remember the processions, the May crowning, the shrines in the streets or villages. Today, the misunderstandings, the distraction of technology, media, etc. have assaulted us Catholics in those wonderful celebrations which strengthen our faith. The sad thing is that little has been done to replace them. The efforts of parishes and groups have drawn little attention from families, parents. The truth is that the games and the sports have taken the place of those devotions that brought heaven a bit closer to us and made it feel more real. We can make an effort to bring some of those traditions back, such as praying the Rosary as a family, decorate a shrine with images of Mary in our home, sing hymns, use technology to find beautiful music, songs, devotions, and participate in whatever the parish is offering. Let us use technology to help us rather than allow it to take control of us and our time. In Mary we can find our place in the Church and in the world, to be humble, obedient to God, available for kindness, and honor JESUS in our own personhood and everyone created by God in his image an likeness. Here are a few words from Thomas Merton to reflect upon:

"In all the great mystery of Mary, one thing remains most clear: that of herself she is nothing, and that God has for our sakes delighted to manifest

His glory and His love in her. It is because she is, of all the saints, the most perfectly poor and the most perfectly hidden, the one who has absolutely nothing whatever that she attempts to possess as her own, that she can most fully communicate to the rest of us the grace of the infinitely selfless God.

#### Third Sunday of Easter

Each moment of the day we make a choice: between people and things. Things, of course, are usually easier to deal with. Things don't require emotional engagement, We don't have to make eye contact with them. We don't have to care about them or concern ourselves with how they feel. When it comes to things, we can disengage any time, walk away, have a cup of coffee, even forget them entirely.

But when it comes to people, that's a different story. Engaging with people usually takes more time than we anticipate. We have to slow down, or speed up, to meet their pace. We have to listen, which means we must empty ourselves of our agenda, and be willing to be present for theirs.

People require our patience, our tenderness, and our compassion. When dealing with tasks or things, we can throw a tool across the room, if frustration gets the better of us. We can't do that with a frustrating person. Not without facing a lawsuit...

...People or things? You and I are always tempted to push away the child, friend or coworker who's asking for our time. We want to favor the task, whether it's making supper, or making a deadline. Jesus asks us to put people first. Because that big wide world out there could use a rescue. One precious person at a time.

#### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Easter, May 8, 2022 – John 10: 27-30

Jesus said: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

#### **Commentary:**

Consider the folks who have led you to become who you are today: family members and first teachers, mentors and heroes, friends, and maybe a few enemies along the way. You may have followed the inspiration of an idea or a dream, or received your greatest encouragement from people you only met in books or learned about from history. In ways we may scarcely be aware of, we have also been led by the small, still voice of our Creator, calling us to a greater and fuller life. If we have been raised in the Christian tradition, we also have been listening to the good news of Jesus Christ down through the years. Though we may stray after our demons from time to time, we can always find our way back to the center if we listen for the voice of Jesus. He calls us to our most authentic selves and tells us who we really are. Even when we are out finding ourselves, we are already found in his hands.

#### **Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?
