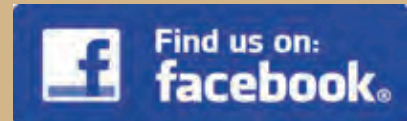

*“The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ...” - ROMANS 8:16-17*

If we are heirs to the kingdom of God, shouldn't we work to build up His kingdom? Shouldn't we be good **Stewards** of our inheritance, using our time in prayer, our talent in charitable works and our treasure to care for the Church that God has left to us? Our Church is a treasured heirloom from God. Do we treat it that way?



## From the Pastor's Desk An Eternal Exchange of Love

Dear Parishioners,

On this **Trinity Sunday**, I share some reflections on the **Holy Trinity**—this profound mystery of our faith.

First, we should realize that Jesus opened up for us the inner life of God. He revealed that God was a Trinity of Persons. Recall, the Jewish people were strict monotheists—**Hear O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone!** (Dt. 6: 4)—and they held on to this belief despite being surrounded, invaded and conquered by various polytheistic cultures (e.g., Rome). However, Jesus began to teach his disciples God is Father—*His* Father—and this must have caused significant concern for those around Him. He equated Himself with God, His Father: **The Father and I are one.** (Jn. 10:30) *What exactly does He mean?* He also promised to send the Holy Spirit to His disciples once He was gone: **But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you.** (Jn. 16: 7) There is no natural way that we could figure out on our own that God was a Trinity of Persons without Jesus revealing this mystery to us.

Next, we are told that **God is love** (1 Jn. 4:8). Therefore, the experience of **love** itself seems to indicate that there should be a *lover* and a *beloved*. Within the Trinity, the Father loves the Son from all eternity and the Son loves the Father from all eternity. The *love* between the two is also a Person: The Holy Spirit. **“God's very being is love. By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange.”** (*Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC # 221*)

I contend that things in this world reflect and model for us certain eternal truths—albeit *imperfectly*—and help us to understand some mysteries of our faith better. Take the example of a **family**. A husband loves his wife and the wife loves her husband. Their love for each other can be manifest in a child who is the result of their love for each other. In essence, there is a type of a *trinitarian* love involved here: the love between husband, wife and child. Again, the example is not perfect as God is *uncreated*, but it does shed some light on an otherwise complicated topic.

Another example from our life experience helps us with our understanding the Trinity. Take **H<sub>2</sub>O** which can appear in nature as water, steam or ice. All three have the same chemical composition but can appear in different forms depending on temperature. This helps us to see how something can be *three* and *one* at the very same time. Our belief in the Holy Trinity teaches that there are Three Divine Persons in the One True God.

Every time you make the *Sign of the Cross*, think about how we acknowledge our belief in the Holy Trinity. By God's immense love for us, we are invited to share in the life of the Trinity and to dwell one day within that **eternal exchange of love**.

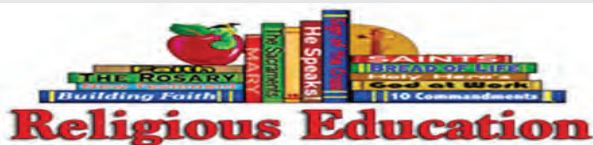
The whole idea can indeed be mind-boggling.

From the Gospel for today, Trinity Sunday 2021; “The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” The apostles present at that moment “doubted”, even after all their experiences with JESUS in person. This should make us feel relieved for we also doubt, or, perhaps, we “wander”. The things of GOD are so high above us that our small “reason” cannot understand. Then we are invited to FAITH, to believe in spite of our doubts or misguided “wandering”. We need to move into “WONDER” or the marvel of JESUS’ revelation. Having been baptized we are now JESUS’ disciples (followers) and we have received the mandate to go and make disciples of all nations, teaching all that we know about JESUS and HIS MESSAGE. It is a given responsibility from Baptism and Confirmation. Disciples are learners who realize that, even though they’re resent, they don’t know much and they need to be continually learning about JESUS and his message. We can’t give what we don’t have and we can’t teach what we don’t know. Prayer, Holy Scripture, Receiving the Eucharist are ways to build our understanding and knowledge of JESUS. The first receivers of our discipleship are our own children. They are learning from us... how important our faith is to us, our dedication to JESUS, our desire for wisdom and truth. We have accountability to them and to JESUS himself, as we are sent by HIM.

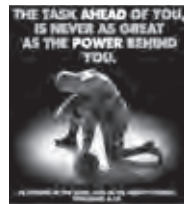
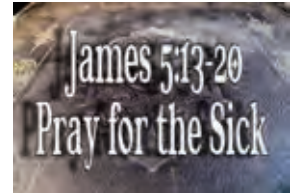

## MOST HOLY TRINITY, MAY 30, 2021

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 6, 2021 - Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

While they were eating, Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and give it to his disciples, saying, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and they all drank from it. "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many," he said to them. "Truly I tell you, I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

#### Commentary:

If you have received worthily, "St. Augustine preached, "you become what you have received." In sharing the body of Christ, we become the body of Christ. If we partake of the one bread and cup, then we must be willing to become Eucharist for others — to make the love of Christ real for all. At our own parish table, we come to the Eucharist to celebrate our identity as his disciples and to seek the sustaining grace to live the hard demands of such discipleship. We make our parish family's table the Lord's own table, a place of reconciliation and compassion.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

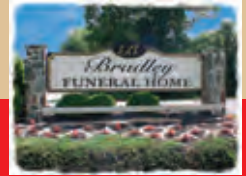

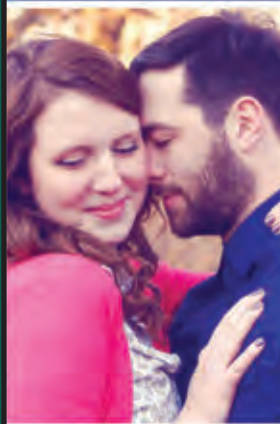
