Stewardship Corner: Most Holy Trinity Sunday Stewardship Prayer

“But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth...” (JOHN 16:13)



Stewardship teaches that the best gift we can give someone is to teach them how to pray. If you don't talk and more importantly, listen, to God every day, how else will you know what He is calling you to do? Just as you talk to family and friends every day, **get in the habit of talking with God every day. Develop a daily prayer routine. Keep your prayers simple and sincere. This is best done in silence, when you can hear His response.**



From the Pastor's Desk O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I Place my Trust in Thee

Dear Parishioners,

June is traditionally the month of the **Sacred Heart** of Jesus. For fourteen years of my life I had worked at a high school named for Our Lord's **Sacred Heart**. The motto of the school was: *Fac Cor Nostrum Secundum Cor Tuum*. (The translation of the Latin: *Make our hearts like unto Thine or Make our hearts like Your Heart*.)

The image of the **Sacred Heart** centers on a devotion to Jesus' physical heart as representing His Divine Love for all humanity. The Sacred Heart is often depicted in Christian art as a flaming heart shining with divine light. It is bleeding, pierced by the lance-wound, surrounded by a crown of thorns, and surmounted by a cross. The wounds and crown of thorns allude to the manner of Jesus' death, while the fire represents the transformative power of Christ's love.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque is associated with the devotion to the Sacred Heart. She entered the Visitation Convent in 1671 and six years later Christ appeared to her in a vision in which she said: "I could plainly see His heart, pierced and bleeding, yet there were flames, too, coming from it and a crown of thorns around it. He told me to behold His heart which so loved humanity. Then He seemed to take my very heart from me and place it there in His heart. In return He gave me back part of His flaming heart."

In all, there were four revelations, during which the now-familiar **Twelve Promises of the Sacred Heart** were made:

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their homes.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and an infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

The last of these promises is responsible for the nine *First Fridays'* devotion. Also requested by the Sacred Heart was the establishment of a feast in His honor. We now celebrate this **Feast of Sacred Heart** on the first Friday after the octave of the *Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ*, in addition to honoring the Sacred Heart every first Friday of the month.

Now that you have a brief history, the "heart" of the matter (*sorry, I couldn't resist*) is whether or not we are becoming more Christ-like and whether our hearts reflect Christ's love for us.

The simple prayer said daily—*Make my heart like Your Heart*—should remind us of the task in front of each of us.


The Catechetical Ministry of the Parish is a most significant one because it aims at passing on the FAITH to children, families, parents, adults. **It is a lay ministry** that is based on the common baptismal state and the royal priesthood received in the Sacrament of Baptism and is essentially distinct from the ordained ministry received in the Sacrament of Orders. Some of them have worked at their task for years. The time comes also for them to move on.

Mrs. Katie Witts has taught 2nd grade and other grades in our parish. She is now moving on to serve in other ministries.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 19, 2022 - Luke 9:11b-17

(Jesus asks the apostles to give the people on the hillside something to eat. There are more than 5,000 people present to listen to Jesus. The apostles complain that they only have five loaves and two fish. Jesus tells the apostles to have the people sit down. Then... "Jesus took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets."

Commentary:

Maybe the most perfect meal of all is the one in which no one goes home hungry. That's a meal yet to be celebrated on this planet, since a large portion of the human race goes to bed without having eaten at all. It is no exaggeration to say that it is the responsibility of those who enjoy the privilege of the Eucharist to make our best and most earnest contribution to the problem of world hunger. Every dollar we spend to eliminate hunger honors the example of Jesus, who fed the multitude in front of him simply because they were hungry. His words on that occasion - "Give them some food yourselves" - ring down through the centuries with an urgency and authority that we cannot ignore. Jesus also said, "What you do for the least of my sisters and brothers, you do for me." Dare we deny bread to the One who set the table that supplies us with everlasting life? And if we wonder how much we are obliged to give, the answer is plainly given. All must eat until they are satisfied, and then our offering can be deemed enough.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?


