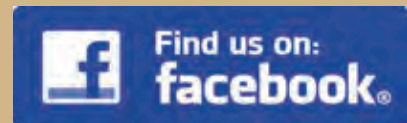

## From the Pastor's Desk

“So You Could Not Keep Watch with Me  
for One Hour?”

Dear Parishioners,

The time for our **40 Hours** of Eucharistic Adoration begins next Sunday (6/20/21) after the 11 AM Mass. Our Eucharistic Lord will be present continually on the altar for prayer and adoration (except when there is a scheduled Mass) until 9 AM on Tuesday (6/22/21). We conclude our devotion on the memorial of our patron, [St. Thomas More](#). Masses on Monday will be at **9 AM** and also **7 PM**.

I have asked all of you to consider spending at least one hour during these days before Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

What are some of the things that we might possibly pray for during this time?

**For those in our family or among our relatives and friends who no longer practice their Catholic faith or who have abandoned it.**

**For priestly or religious vocations in our Church. (Remember our diocese is not scheduled to ordain any priests in 2023.)**

**In reparation for our sins. (I know I need to spend a few hours myself on my knees with this intention in mind!)**

**In thanksgiving for the many blessings God has bestowed on us during our lives. (Most of us probably do not say “thank you” quite enough.)**

**For our Catholic Church: for clarity in her teaching and doctrine; for holiness in her leaders; for healing in those who have been hurt or abused; that all of her members may walk the path to salvation and eternal happiness.**

**For our deceased relatives and friends; for the forgiveness of their sins and lessening of any time in purgatory.**

**For our enemies. Didn't Jesus remind us to pray for them? (See Mt. 5: 43-48)**

Maybe you just might need to spend some quiet time with Our Lord listening to what He might say to your heart.

During this time of year there are fans who will spend hours and hours watching game after game. There are other people who will be fixated in front of their tablets, computers, televisions or phones for multiple hours. There are still others who will work out at the gym several times each week religiously. How much quality time do you think is given to **prayer** by the average person?

Right before His crucifixion, while Jesus was agonizing in the garden of Gethsemane about his impending suffering and death, He asked His disciples to take time to pray with Him. Could you ever imagine His disappointment when He found them *sleeping* instead? “So you could not keep watch with me for one hour?” (Mt. 26:40)

**One hour** of your time for the Lord who gave His life for us. Is that too much to ask?

**Religious Education**

Trees BY JOYCE KILMER

*"I think that I shall never see a poem lovely as a tree. A tree whose hungry mouth is prest against the earth's sweet flowing breast; A tree that looks at God all day, And lifts her leafy arms to pray; A tree that may in Summer wear a nest of robins in her hair; Upon whose bosom snow has lain; Who intimately lives with rain. Poems are made by fools like me, But only God can make a tree."*



The Bible settings are often in the wilderness, desert, water, fields, animals, orchards, vineyards. Yes, because the survival of the people depended on the food grown, harvested, preserved. Are we able in our technological society to even have a glimpse of what life was like then? The first reading of today, 11th Sun. in Ordinary Time, is about the "Cedar" a strong tree and likening it to the people of Israel of those days, and each person in that group of people among so many other clans of people. In reading this passage from Ezekiel today, can we see or find ourselves in it, as a people of God? Can each of us find ourselves as someone so greatly loved by GOD? God endowed each of us with so many gifts, with a beauty that cannot be measured by human proportions. We stand on a lofty mountain, the mountain of GOD's love. We reach out to others in our works of mercy, others find comfort among our branches, our leaves and flowers. Can we imagine ourselves as a tree that only GOD can create, that stands in God's presence all day, that prays unceasingly, that offers a home to the birds of the air, and its own flowers, fruits, seed for others, free of cost? We have many lessons to be learned by us and taught to our children, just by Prophet Ezekiel's passages and Joyce Kilmer's poem.

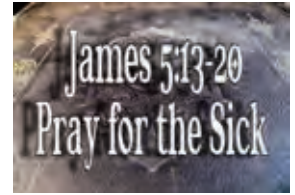

## Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 20, 2021: Mark 4: 36-41

"That evening, Jesus said to His followers, 'Let us go across the lake.' Leaving the crowd behind, they took Him in the boat just as He was. There were also other boats with them. A very strong wind came up on the lake. The waves came over the sides and into the boat so that it was already full of water. Jesus was at the back of the boat, sleeping with His head on a cushion. His followers woke Him and said, 'Teacher, don't you care that we are drowning!' Jesus stood up and commanded the wind and said to the waters, 'Quiet! Be still!' Then the wind stopped and it became completely calm. Jesus said to His followers, 'Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?' The followers were very afraid and asked each other, 'Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey Him!'"

### Commentary:

All of us can easily relate to the terror that the disciples feel when their fishing boat is being slammed to and fro in the wild seas. Swamped and going down for what seems like the third time, we too may feel that the One who is supposed to take care of us and sleeps through our disaster has abandoned us. We all face waters with undertows that we are sure will take us out to sea, leaving us feeling like we are doomed to drown. It's part of human nature to be frightened. What does a believer who is stuck in a storm do? Like the disciples, we bring the terror to Jesus, revealing that we, like them, doubt that Jesus is really with us. But He is with us. He responds to our cry, just as He did to the disciples'. He calms the seas that roil around us. The seas must still be navigated, but Jesus is a worthy shipmate and captain. Call on Him.

### Questions for Reflection:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the commentary resonates with me?

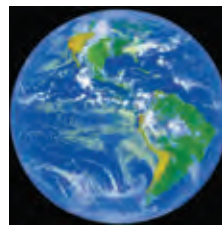
