Stewardship Wisdom

St. Francis of Assisi once said, "Remember, you are what you are in the eyes of God, and nothing else." We often forget this **Stewardship** wisdom when we spend all of our time, talent and treasure to gain more of the world's riches. We need to set our priorities based on God's values and not the values of the material world.



From the Pastor's Desk

Being in the "State of Grace"

Dear Parishioners,

Whenever I ask someone "What is **Grace**?" I have to be prepared to hear some varying answers. I also need to be ready to give a clear and understandable explanation myself.

Simply stated, Grace is *God's life within us*. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*:

Grace is a participation in the life of God. It introduces us into the intimacy of Trinitarian life: by Baptism the Christian participates in the grace of Christ, the Head of his Body. As an "adopted son" he can henceforth call God "Father," in union with the only Son. He receives the life of the Spirit who breathes charity into him and who forms the Church. (#1997)

Because of original sin, we are not naturally born into God's Grace. We need to be baptized for this to happen. Therefore, Christian parents should be ready to baptize their children *as soon as possible*. Church (canon) law states the following:

Parents are obliged to take care that infants are baptized in the first few weeks; as soon as possible after the birth or even before it, they are to go to the pastor to request the sacrament for their child and to be prepared properly for it. (Can. 867 §1)

To remain in the state of God's Grace, a person should not be conscious of having committed any **serious** (mortal) sin. All serious (mortal) sin is ordinarily forgiven in the **Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation** (confession), not merely by recourse to an *act of contrition* or something similar. This is not to say that God cannot work in other ways, at His discretion and according to His will. However, a Catholic Christian who is conscious of having committed a serious sin should ordinarily avail himself or herself of the **Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation**. This sacrament restores us—*reconciles us*—to God's Grace.

To me, it is essential to strive to remain constantly in God's Grace. There should never be a time when I want to be alienated or disconnected from the **Source** of all life, love, goodness, truth and beauty. I should endeavor to eliminate all serious sin out of my life—realizing that I need the gift of God (His favor or *grace*) to do that. In other words, we are totally dependent on God and His goodness to us for all we have, and we need to cooperate with Him constantly.

With all of the above in mind, I believe too many people in our culture sometimes think that only something as extreme as *murder* is a *serious* sin. Believe me, there are many other grave sins out there! Serious sin meets the traditional criteria of **sufficient reflection** (*I thought about it and know it is wrong*), **grave matter** (*the subject matter is objectively serious*) and **full consent of the will** (*I freely choose to do the act even though I know it is seriously wrong*). Actions including theft, calumny, detraction, adultery, fornication, worship of a false god, perjury, euthanasia, abortion, blasphemy and various other sins can ordinarily be considered objectively grave. If the person *knowingly* and *willingly* carries them out, they can certainly fall into the category of **mortal sin**. Moreover, the seven deadly sins (pride, covetousness, lust, anger, gluttony, envy and sloth) can be examined as a root cause of all grave sin. Then, to add some more food for thought, there are the various **sins of omission** that Jesus mentions in the Gospel passage of the *Final Judgment* (See Mt. 25: 31-46)


Our striving to remain in God's Grace and to avoid all sin—but most especially serious sin—can be difficult, but remains always possible thanks to God's unconditional love for us!




Religious Education

The readings of this week express the constant struggle between our human nature and the Divine Presence in US. God sees way ahead of us, we have limited far sight. God's wisdom is unlimited. Our wisdom, unless inspired by GOD, is very limited. If not enlightened by God's Spirit, our human wisdom may lead us quite astray from God's way.

Yes, God wants us to follow not the unpopular ways of the world, but to seek Divine Wisdom. This seeking lasts a lifetime, we are never done seeking God's wisdom, the presence of the Holy Spirit in us. At times we do feel "duped" ourselves, as we experience God calling us where we don't want to go; to understand and act what we may not want to understand or act upon, Especially we feel "duped" when things don't work out our own way, for whatever reason. We may even say: "Come on, FATHER IN HEAVEN, talk to me!" **How do we become able to help our children to trust in GOD, if we are not too sure ourselves? How do we open up to GOD's WISDOM to share it with our children?** The answers are already in us: trust, faith, sometimes even blind faith; prayer, following the teachings of our FAITH, and not assume that "I know better" and I decide for myself. Jesus in the Gospel of this Sunday tells us about going to Jerusalem to die. We know what happened after that. His words in the garden were: "Father not as I will, but as you will." JESUS IS the Way, the Truth and the Life.




Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept. 6, 2020 - Matt. 18:15-20

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' ...Amen, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. Again, amen, I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

Commentary:

Perhaps the greatest challenge of this Sunday's gospel doesn't lie in the humility it takes to face another or be faced by one's self for our sinfulness, but in believing that we truly are all members of the one human family and the one body of Christ. Any reconciliation or forgiveness that comes about rests squarely on this inescapable shared identity. Our being bound together in community makes reconciliation an essential aspect of who we are. Conversely, conflict and separation are more than disruptions in relationships or even community life; they actually eat away at our very identity.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
