Remember, the Lord calls us to **Stewardship**, where we nurture and develop our gifts. He calls us to be generous with all the gifts He has given us, especially the one that means the most to us.

## From the Pastor's Desk



### “God Will Still Be God Tomorrow”

Dear Parishioners,

The ancient Hebrews often saw God as the stable force in their lives. They referred to Him as *my rock, my fortress, my deliverer* (Psalm 18:2) and *my rock of refuge, my shield, my saving horn, my stronghold* (Psalm 18:3).

I wonder how much we realize our true dependence on God *for everything?*

In our American society we might think of ourselves as *rugged individuals*. We speak of the *self-made* man or woman. We might save and plan financially for retirement so that we can be comfortable later in life, free of all worries. With this mindset, perhaps there is an affinity to songs like *My Way* (Paul Anka or Frank Sinatra) or *My Life* (Billy Joel) because they speak of our independence and freedom to do what we want, when we want to do it.

If it were not for God willing it, however, we would not be in existence at all. Every breath we take, every thought we think, every action we attempt are all within God's permissive will. He allows them to happen. All good things that we have, things that we might often take for granted, are pure **gift** from God—His Grace.

Yes, it is also true that God has given us *intelligence* and *free-will*. We are made in His image and likeness and He gives us tools that we are expected to use responsibly. We might sometimes think that we act independent of Him, especially when we choose to do something on our own, even against His will. However, it is because He has given us free-will in the first place that we are capable of various diverse acts such as *loving, forgiving, hating, or sinning* at all.

Jesus reminds us not to worry about material things. He speaks of the importance of *relying on God* for everything, and not on ourselves:

**Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat [or drink], or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they? Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span? Why are you anxious about clothes? Learn from the way the wild flowers grow. They do not work or spin. But I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was clothed like one of them. (Mt. 6: 25-29)**

Jesus continues:

**But seek first the kingdom (of God) and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides. Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself. Sufficient for a day is its own evil. (Mt. 6: 33-34)**

Personally, I use an expression with those I know, reminding them in the midst of worry, or during some trial and tribulation that **“God will still be God tomorrow.”** God is always here—with us—in some mysterious, unseen way. He remains constant, a rock, a source of refuge for us. He is here *now* and will continue to be here for us *tomorrow and beyond*.


We should reflect often on God's ever-abiding Divine Providence. Once we realize that He is with us always, even the greatest of obstacles no longer seems so insurmountable.

One thing we can all say about GOD as a Father and Creator is that GOD is utterly honest. He is LOVE but he is also TRUTH. Yes, it is true that God knows us and all about us. Nothing is hidden to God, nothing in the whole universe. If it were not so, then GOD would not be omniscient. Utter truth is about being able to see ourselves as we are before GOD. Can we face GOD and say: Here is my “utterly me” in complete integrity of mind and heart”? At this time of so much uncertainty, wonderment, lack of trust, can it be said that there is utter truth spoken in the public forum? Truthful things may be said and used to enhance the public opinion for oneself, but that would not make one truthful. May we pray Psalm 139 to help us understand that we need to live in GOD’s sight first.

*“O Lord you search me and you know me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar. You search out my path and my lying down and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, behold, O LORD, you know it altogether. You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. Where shall I go from your Spirit?... If I say, ‘Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light about me be night,’ even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is bright as the day, for darkness is as light with you. For you formed my inward parts; you knitted me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. How precious to me are your thoughts, Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!”*

Let us talk to our children about utter truth, honesty, integrity, honor, valor, courage. Jesus, St. Thomas More, St. John the Baptist stood for the truth. It takes real bravery.



**Make Me an Instrument of Your Peace:  
A Prayer for Civility**

*“Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where uncivil words prevail, show me how to model love. Help me remember the God-given dignity of all, and invite others to do the same. Show me how to build bridges and not walls and see first what unites us rather than how we diverge. Let me seek to understand before asking to be understood. Give me a listening heart filled with empathy and compassion. May I be clear in sharing my own position and respectful and civil in describing those of others. May I invite all to charity and love. Lord, help me to imitate your compassion and mercy. Make me an instrument of Your peace.*




## Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

### **Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept. 13, 2020 - Matt. 18:21-35**

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times."

#### **Commentary:**

Peter's not fooling anyone, not the least the discerning heart of Jesus. His real question to his teacher is not, "How often must I forgive?" but rather "When can I legitimately stop forgiving my brother?" It's a question most of us will face many times in dealing with that most difficult and dreadful species: the family member. After all, with whom do we have the most dealings, and who is most likely to require our multiple and protracted forgiveness?

#### **Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?



#### **PRO-LIFE Corner:**

You must remember that some things legally right are not morally right. Abortion and euthanasia are prime examples of this statement. Work and pray to end these atrocities.

#### **Death Penalty in the United States**

In June 2019, the Attorney General directed the U.S. Bureau of Prisons to begin preparations to resume federal executions. While states have carried out numerous executions over the past several decades, there have been no federal executions since 2003.

The United States is one of just a handful of nations and the only one in the Western Hemisphere to carry out state-sanctioned killings. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on human dignity, which is never lost. It is recognized that states have means to protect residents from aggressors without taking their lives.
