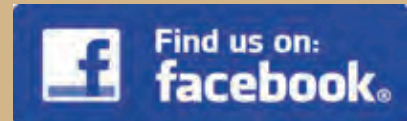

**Stewardship Corner: 24<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time  
Stewardship Lifestyle**

“Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.” *MARK 8:34*

Living a **Stewardship** lifestyle means not only being responsible for my own life, but for the lives of others as well. We realize that our gifts are not intended for ourselves, rather they are meant to be shared with others. “Taking up my cross” means doing things when someone else needs me and not when it's convenient for me.



## From the Pastor

### Reflecting on the Cross

Dear Parishioners,

You will find that I refer to the **cross** of Jesus quite frequently when I preach. Maybe I have been profoundly influenced by St. Paul: *I preach Christ Jesus and Him crucified.* (See 1 Cor. 2:2 and 1 Cor. 1:23)

Typically, I will point to the image of the **crucified** Jesus. While some churches have an image of the *resurrected Jesus* in the sanctuary, as I did in a former parish, I really must confess that I am not quite there yet in my own spiritual life. I relate better to the *crucified Jesus* who truly knew suffering and experienced death. Intellectually, I know that **JESUS IS RISEN**, and I certainly preach Him as risen from the dead. However, whether it be in my personal chapel in the rectory, or in the church itself, I look to the crucified Jesus—to the *crucifix*—more often than not.

Each day I see suffering in the world. When I turn on the evening news, read a newspaper or find an article on the internet, so many of the stories involve tragedy: a plane going down, a hurricane, a wildfire, a flood, war, violence, murder, etc. I see people suffering and dying. I visit the hospital and I find someone extremely sick with family members surrounding him or her in tears. I visit the homebound. I celebrate a funeral Mass. Get the picture?

Jesus knew suffering. Meditating on the sorrowful mysteries of the Holy Rosary, making the Stations of the Cross, reading an account of Jesus' passion in the Sacred Scriptures, *looking at a crucifix*, all tell me that Christ can relate to the pain and suffering of humanity.

I ponder the image of the Risen Christ and truly hope to be there *someday*. I also realize that resurrection and eternal life are still somewhere—with God's grace and through His forgiveness, mercy and love—in the future for me.

However, I continue look at the **crucifix**. Maybe I do not receive immediate answers to all my prayers. Maybe I still have questions and doubts. But what I see is a God who loved me enough to suffer and to die for me. I see Jesus who willingly accepted suffering and experienced it to the depth of his being. I see a humble, vulnerable God who took upon Himself all our sins—my sins. I see Jesus who **died for me**, for all of us.

At this point in time, you can see where I am in my personal spiritual life. I see myself at the foot of the cross. I hope someday for resurrection and eternal life. But I am, unfortunately, just not there yet.

**Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it. (Mark 8: 34b-35)**

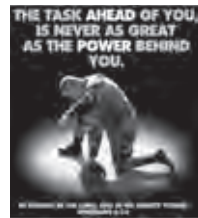
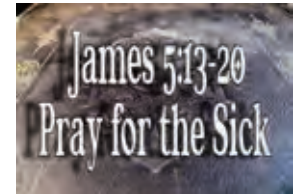

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

**Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept. 19, 2021 - Mark 9:30-37**

They came to Capernaum and, once inside the house, he began to ask them, "What were you arguing about on the way?" But they remained silent. They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest. Then Jesus sat down, called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

**Commentary:**

Jesus teaches the power of "powerlessness." The Apostles still don't "get it." They struggle with each other for position and power. Jesus answers with a symbolic action that is stronger than words. He embraces a child, a symbol of powerlessness. He directs the Apostles not to build up a power structure but to embrace powerlessness. In the same way, the power of the Christian community will be in powerlessness.

**Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



**PRO-LIFE CORNER:** The fact that what we believe about marriage – that it should be between a man and a woman – and that we're pro-life, somehow that becomes radical? Why is that? It's because our culture has changed. But the truth is, culture may change, people change, but the Word of God never changes, and that's what we believe and trust in.

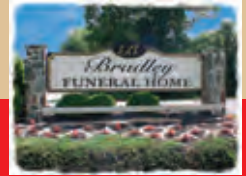
