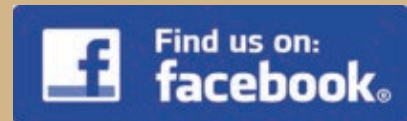

From the Pastor's Desk

Mary, Our Mother of Sorrows



Dear Parishioners,

This past week we celebrated the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross** (September 14th) followed immediately by **Our Lady of Sorrows** (September 15th). Are you familiar with the *Seven Sorrows of Our Blessed Mother*? Mary experienced pain and sorrow during her life, in union with her Son and His Passion.

When Jesus was **Presented in the Temple** (1), Simeon foretold that Mary's heart would know pain:

"Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." (Lk. 2: 34-35)

Subsequently, Mary knew additional grief and anxiety when she and Joseph, her spouse, necessarily fled to Egypt (2) to escape from King Herod and his command to kill all Hebrew boys two years old and younger.

. . . **The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him." Joseph rose and took the child and his mother by night and departed for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod . . .** (Mt. 2: 13-15a)

Later, Jesus was eventually **Found in the Temple** (3) at age twelve after having been missing for three days. "Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." (Lk. 2: 48)

Although she raised and cared for Jesus, her Divine Son, she was at the same time His faithful follower until the bitter end. She met Him on the way to his crucifixion on the road to Calvary (4) as we reflect on the *4th Station of the Cross*. She was present during His death, standing at the foot of the cross (5). The image of the *Pieta* reminds us of her holding His lifeless body in her arms (6) after His death. She also watched as He was subsequently placed in the tomb (7) as we again reflect on the *14th Station of the Cross*.

Mary, from the moment of her **Immaculate Conception**, had God's special graces and protection from sin. She was chosen to be the mother of Our Lord and her "yes" to God at the **Annunciation** showed her obedience and willingness to cooperate with God's plan for our salvation. Although she had some uncertainty concerning how God's plan would unfold in her life, she trusted in God completely. How could a virgin have a child? The power of the Holy Spirit could transcend what is humanly impossible. Nothing is impossible for God!

After showing us an example of her unselfish love by helping her relative Elizabeth who was also with child (**Visitation**), she gave birth miraculously to Our Lord in the humble surroundings of Bethlehem (the **Nativity**).

Mary was present at the **Wedding Feast of Cana** (Jn. 2: 1-11) where she requested her Son's assistance, leading to His first public miracle: changing water into wine. Her fidelity, love and continued intercessory role are evident as she was given to us as our *Spiritual Mother* at the cross (Jn. 19: 25-27). When her earthly life was complete, she was taken body and soul into heaven (the **Assumption**) and she reigns as *Queen of Heaven and Earth* (the **Coronation**).

The **Blessed Virgin Mary** should have a special place in the life of every Catholic (Christian). Traditionally, the month of May has been dedicated to her, and the month of October dedicated to her *Holy Rosary*.

These mysteries of our faith (as well as many others) are found in the *Mysteries of the Holy Rosary*--meditations which are meant to have us reflect on some of most important aspects of our faith. Together with wearing the *Brown Scapular* (of Mt. Carmel) as an outward sign, we can show our love for and devotion to Our Lady. True, healthy devotion to her will only lead us to her Son **Jesus** and never detract from Him.

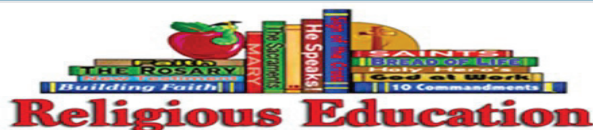
May we learn to imitate the *faith and trust in God*, the *obedience to God's will* and the *love for Jesus* that Our Lady gave witness to in her life. Her example of *purity and sinless-ness* is much needed in today's world. May she continue to intercede for us as our patroness.

This Sunday, September 20, 2020, the Church in the USA celebrates Catechetical Sunday, the official opening of the catechetical classes for our children in parishes throughout the USA. During the past 50 years catechesis has gone through many stages of growth and challenges. As the number of children in our parish programs grew, constant adaptation was necessary.

What about today, where are we?

1) Catechesis means to “echo the teaching of our FAITH. Or, in simple terms, to pass on our FAITH in portions that our younger generations can take in as they grow in age.

2) The Parents and Family are the first and foremost educators in the FAITH by words and example.

3) The parish is to provide ways and tools to teach and pass on the faith to the Children and their families.

4) This year our parish is experiencing unexpected change and growth.

5) We will have a new series of basic text books (grades 1,3,4,5,6) from “SADLIER Religion Publisher” which launches us into a contemporary and innovative way of teaching.

6) This new way requires parental and family involvement, and training for both Catechists and Parents.

7) Because of COVID 19, we are required to go into Remote teaching and learning.

8) All classes will be held on Sunday Morning – Catechists will teach from their home and children will be required to be in class at the given time.

How do I form my conscience?

It takes time to form our consciences so that we can make well-reasoned judgments about particular, real-life situations. The Church teaches that it is important to work continually on our conscience formation so we can be prepared to make decisions whenever the opportunity arises. Some specific ideas to form your conscience are:

1. Begin by being open to the truth and what is right;
2. Study Sacred scripture and the teaching of the Church;
3. Examine the facts and background information about various choices and be discerning in where we gather information;
4. Prayerfully reflect to discern the will of God. (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 18)

Additionally, it is important to consider how our community of faith can help us form good consciences through some of these steps:

1. Seek the prudent advice and good example of trusted leaders and others to support and enlighten our conscience;
2. Learn about the authoritative teaching of the Church;
3. Pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help us develop our conscience;
4. Regularly take part in an examination of conscience to hear God’s voice in your life.

(We will continue to explore this next week)

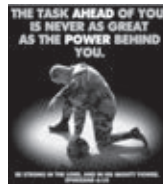
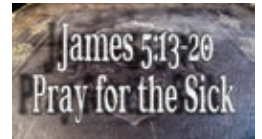

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept 27, 2020 - Matt. 21:28-32

(Jesus relates a story of two sons whose father asks each one to go into the vineyard to work. First son - says "no" but then goes. The second son says "yes" but then does not go. Jesus asks - "Which of the two did his father's will?" Those who were listening to Jesus responded with "the first did his father's will." Jesus responds: "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

Commentary:

The point of this gospel is not whether we are righteous or sinners (all of us are a little of both!) but that we hear God's call, believe, respond in faith, and change our ways. Our entering the kingdom is not dependent upon a single response but on a pattern of fidelity to God's persistent call - it's as though God's persistence gives us every chance possible to respond - hear, believe, change our minds, be faithful. Ultimately our faithful response depends upon our relationship with Jesus and our ability to hear his message.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
