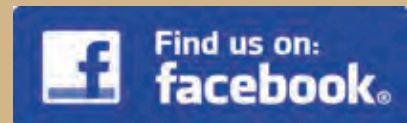

Second, **Stewardship** has been around since the beginning of mankind; it isn't something recently invented by the Church. Just as past generations built our Church, it is now our responsibility to continue to nurture and develop these gifts for future generations



## From the Pastor Marriage: A Covenant of Love and Life

Dear Parishioners,

When I began writing this bulletin column years ago, my intention was to take my pastoral responsibility *to preach* and *to teach* seriously. Hopefully, I shed some insight on particular topics in a simple, straightforward manner. I realize, of course, that the final authority on all Church matters is the **magisterium** or teaching authority of the Church (essentially the pope united with his bishops), and I try to be completely faithful to it.

I think that Catholics need to be kept *up-to-date* on various matters concerning our faith and morality. One such hot button issue is the definition of *marriage*. How do we understand it as Christians? I have used the following working definition of *marriage* in the past in my classroom: **Marriage is a covenant of love and of life, made by a man and a woman, that is permanent, exclusive and open to the possibility of children.** Allow me to take this definition apart:

By saying that marriage is a *covenant*, it means that this pact or agreement goes beyond a legal contract mentality because God is involved in the process. Besides the priest (or deacon) and congregation, the vows exchanged in a marriage ceremony by the couple have God as a witness. The couple comes before God freely to promise their lives to each other—an exchange of *persons*. They should be aware of God’s presence in this process. For Catholics, the ordinary place where this *sacred* covenant is made is in a church building (a sacred consecrated place) rather than some other *secular* place.

The covenant is between one **man** and one **woman**. The Church, following Christ’s instruction (see Mt. 19: 4-6), teaches that this covenant is between a *monogamous, opposite sex* couple. Directly stated, multiple partners and same sex partners are not part of God’s plan for marriage. Multiple partners go beyond the Scriptural “two shall become one flesh” experience. Same sex partners, while they may have love for each other, cannot reproduce with each other through any genital expression of their love. This is a disordered activity that may be pleasurable to them but it is definitely not *life-giving*. Any homosexual genital act is always sterile.

Marriage is *permanent*—“until death do us part.” Part of the marriage vow includes the couple’s promise to each other to remain with each other “all the days of my life.” The Church holds couples to this promise.

Marriage is *exclusive* meaning that there should be no infidelity or adultery. Monogamy is expressed in a “two shall become one flesh” experience.

Finally, marriage needs to be *open to children*. The contraceptive mentality in our culture tries to separate the *love making* act from any *life-giving* possibility. It takes God’s design for human sexuality and tries to re-establish it as a pleasurable, *sterile* act. God gives the married couple the possibility of creating new life—a new human being with an immortal soul—and eliminating this possibility directly through **artificial contraception** is seen as immoral.

As the traditional definition of *marriage* is under continual threat of being redefined, we, as Christians, need to understand the many implications of such an attempted change.

Our Catechism classes began this past Sunday. All children appeared to be happy to find old friends, especially after a year of remote learning classes on Sunday morning. But we hope to continue to hold our classes this here right here, at our parish complex.

We have a wonderful group of enthusiastic Catechists. They have been preparing their syllabus for months, attended meetings, prepared lessons and truly want to make a difference in the children's lives, touching their hearts.

Thus far, we have been sharing about formal catechesis through the teaching of the Catechist. However, there is an informal, experiential catechesis going on in the life of our children. It is the catechesis in the HOME. As the CCC says in no. 2221 "*The role of parents in*



*education is of such importance that it is almost impossible to provide an adequate substitute. The right and the duty of parents to educate their children are primordial and inalienable.*" From the early days of a child's life, parents "gratefully accepting their bundle of JOY", are to remember their accountability before the Heavenly Father. The future is unknown, but they need to acknowledge their responsibility toward the Christian, Catholic traditions, (see CCC no. 2221-2228). It may start with a simple sign of the cross on a child's forehead, but eventually it grows as the child grows, through the teaching of prayers, family and religious traditions. In the home is where the foundations lay for what is awaiting the child or children which will eventually be enhanced by the ministry of the parish in formal catechesis to accompany them.

Anyone knowing of children in the neighborhood needing catechism classes...take the necessary steps to help the child get here on Sunday Morning.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 10, 2021– Mark 10:17-30

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, “Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?”...Jesus responded, “You know the commandments: You shall not kill, etc.” The man said to Jesus, “Teacher, all of these I have observed from my youth.” Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, “You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” At that statement, the man’s face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.

Commentary:

Today’s Gospel illustrates the frequent conflict between wisdom and wealth. The man who asked the secret of everlasting life was clearly a thoroughly good person. But Jesus senses in this man an attitude of not needing anyone else. Jesus tells him, in effect, “All the resources on which you rely are useless. Get rid of them, trust in God, and follow me.” The challenge here was not to poverty as such, but to trust. Salvation is God’s gift, not a reward for human efforts.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

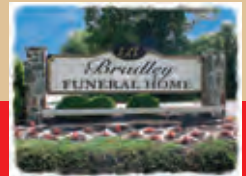
