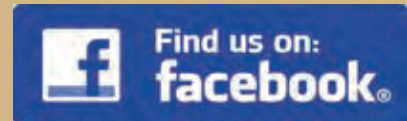

## From the Pastor's Desk

### The Miracle of the Sun



Dear Parishioners,

**October 13<sup>th</sup>** once again marks the anniversary of the miracle of **Fatima**, Portugal.

As I mentioned in this past Sunday's homily, **Our Lady** was reported to have appeared to three shepherd children, **Jacinta** (10), **Francisco** (9) and **Lucia** (7), once every month beginning on May 13, 1917 and ending on October 13, 1917.

On 13 May 1917, ten year old **Lucia dos Santos** and her younger cousins, siblings **Jacinta** and **Francisco Marto**, were tending sheep at a location known as the *Cova da Iria* near their home village of Fatima in Portugal. Lucia described seeing a woman "brighter than the sun, shedding rays of light clearer and stronger than a crystal ball filled with the most sparkling water and pierced by the burning rays of the sun." Our Lady subsequently exhorted the children to do penance and to make sacrifices to save sinners. She also requested that the **Holy Rosary** be prayed daily--for world and personal peace--and that the **Brown Scapular** be worn. She asked that we pray for the *conversion of Russia*. (It should be noted that the beginnings of *Communism* were starting to appear in Russia at the time.)

It was claimed that the Virgin Mary had promised a miracle for the last of her apparitions on October 13<sup>th</sup>, so that all would believe. What transpired became known as the "Miracle of the Sun." A crowd believed to be approximately 70,000 in number, including newspaper reporters and photographers, gathered at the *Cova da Iria*. The incessant rain had finally ceased and a thin layer of clouds cloaked the silver disc of the sun such that it could be looked upon without hurting the eyes. Lucia called out to the crowd to look at the sun. Sometime while Lucia was pointing towards the sun and claiming to have visions of various religious figures in the sky, it is believed that the sun appeared to change colors and to rotate like a fire wheel. Then it seemed as though the sun would crash down to earth. For some the sun appeared to fall from the sky before retreating, for others it seemed to "dance."

An atheistic reporter commented on the event at the time: "*One could see the immense multitude turn towards the sun, which appeared free from clouds and at its zenith. It looked like a plaque of dull silver and it was possible to look at it without the least discomfort. One might have thought an eclipse was taking place. But at that moment a great shout went up and one could hear the spectators nearest at hand shouting: 'A miracle! A miracle!' Before the astonished eyes of the crowd, whose aspect was Biblical as they stood bareheaded, eagerly searching the sky, the sun trembled, made sudden incredible movements outside all cosmic laws - yes, the sun 'danced'!*"

Many of the onlookers were terrified that the sun would crash down upon them. Then, as the sun returned to normal, each person in the crowd realized that they were completely dry despite being soaked from the rain just minutes before.

While the "Miracle of the Sun" was seen and experienced by so many, the miracle more importantly is certainly meant to draw attention to the message: **prayer** (especially the **Holy Rosary**), **penance** and **conversion**. It seems that Our Lady, as a most-loving spiritual mother of us all, tries to warn us and to lead humanity back to her Son, **Jesus**.

Perhaps you may want to read one of the many books about Fatima or watch one of the movies **The Miracle of Our Lady of Fatima** (1952) or the recent release **Fatima** (2020) to become more familiar with the entire story.

Over and over it is being said that “globally, we are living an uncertain, difficult moment in the history of our world and humanity”. Wondering what the future holds is now common to us.

Yet we know this too will pass and a new future era of our making is awaiting us. The question arises often, how may I make the difference in this future world?

The answer is very easy and, at the same time very challenging, **“Live the Gospel of JESUS”**.

We came from, and hopefully leave behind, a time of anxious living, we may call “frenzied”. JESUS often was placed in the back seat, or the basement, and quieted down. We allowed JESUS to speak only at our own convenience.

Now for us Catholics it is time to change. JESUS needs to become a personal friend, in a unique relationship, whereby “he is allowed to freely speak and direct us, while we need to listen in prayer and meditation. The only way WE Catholics can build a new era is “to center our life in JESUS, practicing our faith, becoming involved in the parish”.

It is time to let go of all our excuses and our relativism and replace them with authentic living out of our faith. Isn’t this what our children and teens need? What kind of future are we preparing for them, and, are we teaching them to build with us?

All this requires serious thought and conversion. Even though we are not out of the woods with COVID19, we certainly can start building our inner-self, since that is where it all begins.

Catholics often face difficult choices about how to vote. This is why it is so important to vote according to a well-formed conscience that perceives the proper relationship among moral goods. A Catholic cannot vote for a candidate who favors a policy promoting an intrinsic evil. At the same time, a voter should not use a candidate’s opposition to intrinsic evil to justify indifference or inattentiveness to other important moral issues involving human life and dignity. There may be times when a Catholic who rejects a candidate’s unacceptable position even on policies promoting an intrinsic evil act may reasonably decide to vote for that candidate for other morally grave reasons. Voting in this way would be permissible only for truly grave moral reasons.

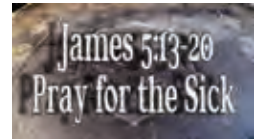

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Oct. 18, 2020 - Matt. 22:15-21

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying, “Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone’s opinion, for you do not regard a person’s status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?” Knowing their malice, Jesus said, “Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax.” Then they handed him the Roman coin. He said to the, “Whose image is this and whose inscription?” They replied, “Caesar’s.” At that he said to them, “Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”

#### Commentary:

Conflict and sarcasm are part of the conversation between Jesus and the Pharisees. Both conflict and sarcasm can be difficult to deal with, yet Jesus does not shy away from either. Ironically, it is the sarcasm that speaks the greatest truth: Jesus is unwaveringly truthful and he addressed the conflict head-on. He has clarity about what is central - God and his kingdom - living a good and holy life - and so he is able to give to God what belongs to God: his very self. Would that we have clarity about our life and duties as Jesus portrays in the gospel! So, keeping our eyes on Jesus, we gain clarity, giving to Caesar (government) what is due, as Jesus did, and giving to God, our very selves, living Gospel lives, loving, truthful, good and honest lives, for God’s greater honor and glory.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
