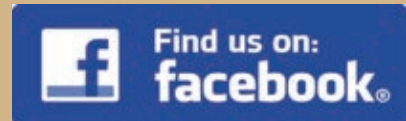

**Stewardship Corner: 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time Stewardship Priority**

*“Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar’s and to God the things that are God’s.”*  
- MATTHEW 22:21

Everything we are and everything we have belongs to God. We aren’t “owners” of anything, we are merely “Stewards” of the gifts God has given each of us. All God is asking is that we give back a portion of what He gave us. This is the essence of Stewardship. **God should be our first priority in everything.** All else comes second, especially our money.

## From the Pastor's Desk



### Thinking Out Loud

Dear Parishioners,

Throughout history, **politics** and **religion** have started wars. Therefore, I generally tend to avoid certain subjects that evoke strong feelings, especially when I am trying to have a peaceful meal, or when I am in mixed company (and I am not sure of one's religious background or political leanings). I attempt to keep matters civil and usually have a *live and let live* attitude toward issues that I see as non-essential or less-important.

Regarding politics, currently we are preparing for another presidential election and I think that many, if not most, people have already made up their minds about how they will vote. What I particularly worry about are those who are not informed of the issues (and their various implications) and people who base their decisions on reasons such as a candidate's *likeability* or popularity instead of more substantive reasons. What also intrigues me is those who will vote for a particular candidate solely because of party affiliation. (I once again state emphatically that I have never sold my soul to any particular political party and I base my vote on the substantive issues, while considering a candidate's moral character, belief system, voting record, etc.)

Certain issues should be of utmost importance for Catholics (and, in fact, for all people with faith in God as Creator). Where does a candidate's party stand on **abortion, euthanasia** (assisted suicide), **traditional marriage, freedom of worship, socialism/Marxism, parent's rights regarding the education of their children**, etc.? How one values every **human life** from conception on should never be minimized or made equivalent to some lesser issue. A candidate's *honesty* and *integrity* need scrutiny. Will the candidate's political positions reflect the biblical values and principles that have guided civilization from its earliest days? What does the person's past track record tell us about future decision making? Is *political correctness* more important than *moral truth*?

Regarding religion, I believe that my Catholic faith should guide how I do all things in life. A **properly formed** conscience should assist me in my decision making. This means that my faith, properly understood, needs to guide and inform my vote.

We have seen biblical examples of those who have stood up to kings and rulers on principle—being anything but *politically correct*—and were not afraid to speak the truth regardless of personal consequence. Notable is **St. John the Baptist** who objected to King Herod's choice of wife and was ultimately beheaded because of his unwavering stance (see Mk. 6: 14-29). Our parish patron, **St. Thomas More**, was also beheaded for standing up to the King Henry VIII on principle.

America's future is going to be shaped by those we choose to represent us in public office—especially the office of President. I suggest that we become informed of the issues, learn about the candidates from their own words and current/past actions (and not just what the *PC media* wants us to hear about them.) Read the party platforms. They are very revealing.

What worries me is that my singular vote, which I intend to take the time to prayerfully and intelligently make, can be nullified by someone else's uninformed vote or by a vote that is motivated by a less-than-altruistic political or social agenda.

This week's readings are so rich in meanings. They all point to the same direction: Listening to GOD and putting GOD first. King Cyrus was not a Jew, and had no idea of "revealed FAITH". Yet God chose HIM to allow the JEWS to reconstruct their history and traditions. After 60 years of being in exile, they return to Jerusalem and began the reconstruction of the city and of the Temple.

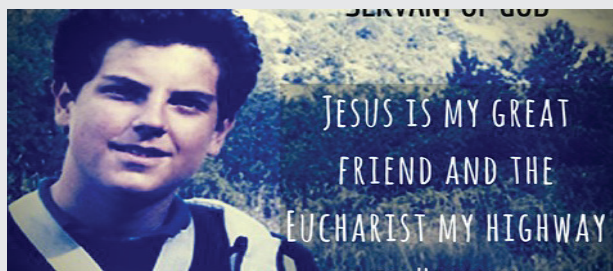
*God spoke thus to Cyrus: "...I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not. I am the LORD and there is no other, there is no God besides me. It is I who arm you, though you know me not, so that toward the rising and the setting of the sun people may know that there is none besides me. I am the LORD, there is no other."*

St. Paul's words "...before our God and Father, know, brothers and sisters loved by God, how you were chosen."

**Last but not least, Jesus' own words:** *"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."*

At one time or another we have been called to live solely for God, following our own specific calling. How powerful is this message! Do we feel compelled to pay attention, listen and turn to God in a new way? God IS calling us to a brand new start every day! Let us teach our children about being aware of GOD's personal way in which they will be called and touched, so that they may respond with enthusiasm, imitating the new Blessed Carlo Acutis, an example just for them.

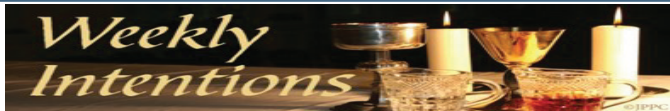

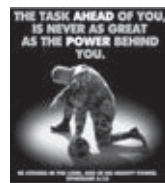
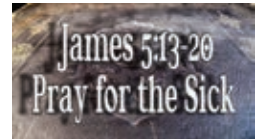

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Oct. 25, 2020 - Matt. 22:34-40

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law, tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments.

Commentary:

Jesus doesn't seem to be phased by the "testing" which is a consequence to the silencing the Pharisees experienced. Jesus seems more intent in connecting with the scholar and responding truthfully. In Jesus' answer, the operative word is "love." Love God, love neighbor, love self. So what does the word love mean? How do I show love of God, self and neighbor in the way I live? From the many possible answers to this question, I like how St. Paul said it: "Love is patient, love is kind, love is not jealous nor does love put on airs, love is not snobbish. Love is never rude, love is not self-seeking, nor is love prone to anger. Love does not brood injuries. Love does not rejoice with what is wrong but love rejoices with the truth... love endures." 1 Cor 13

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?



**PRO-LIFE Corner:** Regarding abortion: The refusal to take sides on great moral issues is itself a decision. It is a silent acquiescence to evil. The tragedy of our time is that those who still believe in defending life lack fire and conviction, while those who believe in abortion are full of passionate conviction. Ask God for the fire of His Holy Spirit to defend life at all stages.
