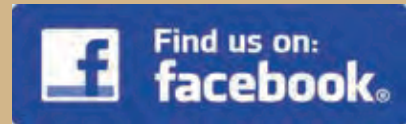

From the Pastor's Desk

A Different Kind of Spiritual Retreat This Year

Dear Parishioners,

By the time you read this, I will have completed my annual retreat. Unfortunately, this year it was not made at a Trappist Monastery, as has been my frequent custom. In fact, the monastery that I have visited for the past 40+ years—the *Abbey of the Genesee* in Piffard, NY—is not receiving visitors at this time due to Covid-19 restrictions. Many of the Trappist Monks are elderly, some even infirm, and I can understand their caution in not accepting retreatants at this time. Maybe next year?

This does not mean that I do not take my annual retreat seriously, despite the unusual circumstances. I have told some that my first month in my new rectory was like being on a 30-day retreat already. The rectory had no TV or internet for about a month after I first moved in. Moreover, in my last assignment I lived with three or four other priests. Suddenly, I was all alone. I knew hardly anyone in this new assignment. People were (and still are) wearing masks so I could not see their faces or observe their expressions. Attendance at Mass was unprecedentedly low. I, for a time, felt like **St. Thomas More** all alone in the *Tower of London* awaiting execution. *Thank God I was able to keep my head through it all!*

Two of my priest-friends, who usually go on retreat with me, joined me this past week in my rectory. We prayed together, watched some pre-recorded spiritual talks on video, offered Mass and enjoyed some camaraderie and fraternity. Everyone knows how unusual 2020 has been, and making an annual spiritual retreat was not exempt.

As I related in an earlier bulletin message, I now have a small chapel in the rectory for prayer and reflection. I am really never alone with Jesus here in the Blessed Sacrament. No matter what part of the day it is—even on those nights where I may have some difficulty sleeping—I can make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament for some peace and solitude.

As Advent progresses, please remember to be counter-cultural and not be celebrating Christmas before it is time to do so. Advent is for spiritual preparation to watch and wait for Jesus. It has been a blessing for me to begin this new liturgical year with some time for prayer and reflection.

The Trappist monks, who begin their daily prayer with *Vigils*, get up when most of us are still sleeping (3:30 AM) and keep watch for the Lord Jesus in communal prayer. It should be a consoling thought that there are contemplatives throughout the world like them who pray for us and the world. Despite their mostly hidden lives, they are active in prayer and manual labor (*ora et labora*). The monks at the *Abbey of the Genesee* have supported the monastery by baking bread (Monks' Bread) and other baked goods. Besides the opportunity to pray and worship with the monks, I will miss not being able to bring home a few loaves of *Monks' Bread* this year!

Oh well! My stomach does not need the additional carbs anyway.

Advent: a time of “JOY”. I hear some saying, “Really? Did you look around? Are you for real?” What are we to be joyful about?” We are invited to trust in the Lord by Isaiah: “Yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles; they will run and not get tired; they will walk and not become weary.” In the Acts of the Apostles we find: “I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams.” Awesome words. Pope Francis just wrote a book, the title of which is “**Let Us Dream a Path to a Better Future**”. And who are the actors in this “better future?” Each one of us. In his book he just wants to tell us what this better future is like. “Older people can dream new dreams of what never was, young people can envision what the future could be like with GOD at the center of the universe and of our lives. Pope Francis ends the books with the following poem (not his own) **HOPE**

“When the storm has passed and the roads are tamed and we are the survivors of a collective shipwreck, With tearful heart and our destiny blessed, we will feel joy simply for being alive. And we’ll give a hug to the first stranger and praise our good luck that we kept a friend. And then we’ll remember all that we lost and finally learn everything we never learned. And we’ll envy no one for all of us have suffered and we’ll not be idle but more compassionate. We’ll value more what belongs to all than what was earned. We’ll be more generous and much more committed. We’ll understand how fragile it is to be alive. We’ll sweat empathy for those still with us and those who are gone. We’ll miss the old man who asked for a buck in the market, whose name we never knew, who was always at your side. And maybe the poor old man was your God in disguise. But you never asked his name because you never had the time. And all will become a miracle. And all will become a legacy. And we’ll respect the life, the life we have gained. When the storm passes, I ask you Lord, in shame, that you return us better, as you once dreamed us.”

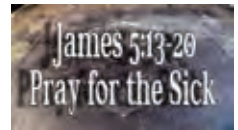

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Advent, December 13, 2020 - John 1:6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the Light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the Light, but came to testify to the Light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,'" as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is One among you whom you do not recognize, the One Who is coming after me, Whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Commentary:

In this Gospel, John the Baptist saw his role clearly. At the time John was writing his Gospel, followers of John the Baptist were claiming that he, not Jesus, was the Messiah. So here the Gospel writer emphasizes that John the Baptist saw himself as one to prepare the way for the Messiah. He is not the Messiah nor any of the others they suggest. He is just "a voice in the desert" preparing the way for the Lord. His baptism is a simple water rite, unlike Jesus' baptism in the Holy Spirit. John the Baptist proclaims the Good News of Jesus' coming and prepares people's hearts for that event.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

THIS WEEK'S STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION:

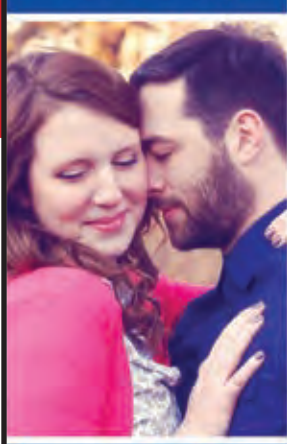
