## **Our Children are a Cherished and Precious Gift from God**

The media has brought to our attention the issue of child sexual abuse by priests in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The Grand Jury claims that priest abusers were not dealt with appropriately by Church Administration.

This discovery is surely another time for me to join with all the good bishops, good priests and good religious of our church in expressing my profound sorrow that some of our priests were responsible for this abuse of minors. For I understand that your children are your most precious gift.

Your children are your gift from God. And so, we continue to apologize to the victims. We continue to apologize to their parents and loved ones. Indeed, we profoundly apologize for this egregious moral failure on the part of a small number of our emotionally disturbed priests.

We will continue to grieve for a long time for all those who were molested by priests. We will continue to grieve for their families. We will continue to grieve for the whole Catholic community. And we will continue to grieve because the reality of child sexual abuse by some emotionally disturbed priests is a most painful truth.

This painful truth is that children have been harmed. Children have been robbed of their youth. Child sexual abuse is a grave offense. Child sexual abuse is a crime. Child sexual abuse is immoral. Child sexual abuse is a sin. Faith and trust have been shattered.

This fresh revelation by the Grand Jury of crime, sin and scandal in the church is a great source of pain and hurt for all Catholics throughout this region, our country and our world. At times our own emotional state may best be described as one in which we experience tremendous embarrassment, shame and guilt.

The current revelation by the Grand Jury of alleged cover up in our church signals the need for a greater openness on the part of church leadership. Otherwise, the church will repeat past mistakes and past sins.

Without in-depth reflection and ownership, the church will commit the same crimes and sins and make new mistakes in the future. Otherwise, our precious children will not be safe. And, as all of us know, the safety of children is our ultimate concern.

Today, around the country, it is the nationally adopted church policy that any priest with a substantial allegation of child molestation is being dismissed from any form of ministry. This is certainly the policy in our own Diocese of Camden. It is believed to be the safest action for the church and for the well-being of our society.

Further, as of this date all our priests and religious as well as all our teachers in our schools and catechists in our Religious Education Programs within our Diocese have had background checks and have been fingerprinted to ensure safer environments for all our children in all parishes throughout our Diocese. Background checks are also carried out on all our youth ministry advisors and anyone dealing with our children.

This is a time for prayer. We pray for our children who have been abused. We pray for their families. We pray for their loved ones. We pray for the whole church.

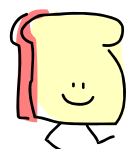

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for the proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday.

Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 27, 2011 - Matthew 6:24-34

Jesus said, "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?"

"So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' Your heavenly Father knows that you need them. Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all things will be given to you as well."

#### Commentary:

Jesus challenges us to put our trust only in God. Jesus tells his followers, "You cannot give yourself to God and money." The operative words here are "give yourself". To live a responsible life in today's world, we must deal with financial concerns. But when this concern becomes an obsession, money (or a career) becomes one's goal, one's god, one's master. What we are and what we have are gifts from God. Excessive worry indicates a lack of trust in God.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. Share a word or phrase from today's Gospel reading or the commentary that spoke to you.
2. Share one way you will appreciate the life you have this coming week.
3. Relate a period in your life when you felt it necessary to get your priorities straight.
