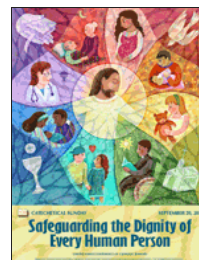

WMOF was conceived by Saint Pope John Paul II in 1992 to look at strengthening the sacred bonds of the family unit across the globe. The first WMOF took place in Rome in 1994, the International year of the family.

Every three years since 1994, families from all over the world are invited by the Holy Father to attend this global gathering. At the conference, families share their thoughts, dialogue and prayers, working together to grow as individuals and family units. Families can participate in discussion groups on the Christian family's role in the church and society, led by many distinguished speakers.

## SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, JULY 19, 2015

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 26, 2015 - John 6:1-15

[A large crowd came to listen to Jesus. Jesus asks Philip where they can get food to feed the people. Even 200 days' wages worth of food would not be enough, Philip tells Jesus. A young boy has a few fish and a few loaves of bread. More than 5000 people must be fed.] "Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted." [Jesus then tells the Apostles to gather the leftovers.] "So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat..." When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world."

#### Commentary:

An astonishing sign! Who is this man? A miracle worker? A prophet? A king? Yes—but more. The superabundance of food Jesus provides from so little is a sign of the fullness of life Jesus has to offer. We turn to Jesus not just for bread to eat but for life itself.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

**Pro-Life Corner:** Our society is phony in its attitude toward handicapped children. We sponsor the Special Olympics, and cheer on the Down's Syndrome competitors, speaking of the joy and inspiration they bring us, but when we hear a woman is carrying a special needs baby, society says, "Kill it before it is born." Oh, God, help us to change and choose life.
