Stewardship Reflection: 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time—Stewards Serve God

“When I entered your house, you did not give me water for my feet....” Luke 7: 44a

Today's Gospel calls us to consider how our Stewardship serves God. Do we consume like the Pharisee who simply reclines at the table and expects to be served? Or do we contribute like the woman who kneels before Jesus and washes His feet? Every day we must make a choice. Take or give? Consume or contribute? Recline or serve?

A Few Words from John Mohan, Parish Trustee, at
Fr. Phillip Johnson's Installation Mass, June 4, 2016.

Bishop Sullivan, Fr. Johnson, Parishioners and Friends of St. Thomas More Parish:

Good afternoon. My name is John Mohan, and I serve as a trustee of our parish along with Greta Tyrrell. Welcome to all. Thank you for coming to this Mass as we give honor and praise to our God and thank Him for the gifts that have been given to us.

To Bishop Sullivan: Thank you for appointing Fr. Phillip as the fourth Pastor of St. Thomas More Parish. A priest worthy of his appointment.

To our Pastor, Fr. Phillip Johnson: Congratulations on your appointment as Pastor of St. Thomas More on this, the 48th year as a parish of the Diocese of Camden.

To our Parishioners: Thank you for making St. Thomas More a warm and welcoming Christian Community. It is a joy to be a part of this community.

Pope Francis has said, "being a pastor means believing everyday in the grace and strength that comes from the Lord ...and to speak in a way that the faithful can recognize." And so it is with Fr. Phillip. As Pastor, Father encourages his parishioners to connect everyday life experiences with believing, trusting, thanking, and loving our Creator through activities and parish groups.

As Pastor, he teaches us through the Sacraments—daily Eucharist, anointing of the sick (more often than we realize); the sacrament of reconciliation which is available each Saturday and by appointment when requested; holy baptisms and marriages which remind us all of sacraments we have received and promises that have been made; and Christian burial which offers us the comfort and hope of our Faith.

As Pastor, Fr. Phillip speaks to his parishioners through sermons and writings. Some 75 articles have appeared in our weekly parish bulletin and the website. This includes a series on "The Catholic Faith in Slow Motion" teaching us the truth and beauty of what we believe and profess. Other articles address prayer and fasting, giving and forgiving, songs and psalms, and "rejoicing with those who rejoice." And recently he provided an outline for reading Pope Francis' exhortation on the pastoral care of families, "The Joy of Love" which appeared in the Catholic Star Herald.

Today is a day we rejoice—rejoicing with Fr. Phillip who was ordained by Bishop Galante and is today formally installed by Bishop Sullivan as Pastor of St. Thomas More Church. It is a day we can recognize, appreciate and thank Father for all he has given to our parish over the past four years. It is a day we can look to the future in knowing this man of God has blessed our parish.

Thank you Bishop Sullivan. Thank you Father Phillip.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 19, 2016 - Luke 9:18-24

Jesus said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" And Peter answered, "The Christ of God." But he charged and commanded them to tell this to no one, saying, "The Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised." And he said to all, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake, he will save it.

Commentary:

Jesus is so much in touch with His ultimate mission "to suffer greatly", "be rejected", "be killed" and "be raised"—that he actually defines his identity in terms of it. His mission is an extension of who Jesus is—Savior. Through Baptism we share in Jesus' identity and mission—we are plunged into the waters of baptism, dying to self and rising to new life in Christ and thus are made members of the Body of Christ. Our own identity and mission is that of Jesus: to die to self so that we are raised to new life. Following Jesus has its cost. The statement in the Gospel is true: we save our lives by losing them. We know this is true because Jesus showed us the way.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



Another real casualty of abortion, besides the babies who are killed and the mothers who suffer from post-abortion syndrome, is our own humanity. 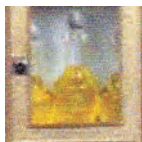
Six Ways I Can Make My Parish Better

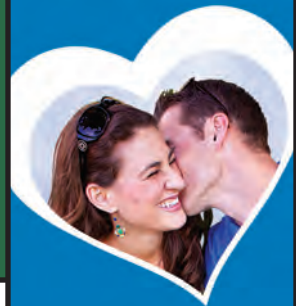
