

The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (No.80)

Fr. Phillip Johnson

A series of reflections on professing, praying, thinking, and living the Faith of the Church Summer Reading for the Mind, Heart, and Spirit

Catholic culture is a literate culture. Catholics understand that faith seeks an ever-deeper understanding. The great Christian philosophers, theologians, poets, and novelists may help to steep the intellect and imagination in the mysteries of the Faith. For some of us, summer vacations will bring time for reading. Along with the recent best seller, why not feed your faith on the thoughts of one or two well-tested Christian authors? Two of the ten authors are not Roman Catholics, but I promise they will do you only good. Three are converts, as your might expect from me. All titles should be available through on-line booksellers. None on the following list are "academic".

On Current Issues and Controversies of the Day . . .

Bio Ethics: A Primer for Christians, by Gilbert Meilaender. The author has the gift of explaining complex issues clearly and with beautiful prose. In 117 pages he helps us understand what is at stake, morally speaking, in the pressing bio-ethical questions of the day.

The Truth of Catholicism: Inside the Essential Teachings and Controversies of the Church Today, by George Weigel. A political philosopher, journalist, and sometime TV commentator, Weigel clarifies and defends basic theological and moral Catholic teachings. Among his other works is the massive Witness to Hope: The Biography of Pope John Paul II.

The Thrill of the Chaste: Finding Fulfillment While Keeping Your Clothes On, by Dawn Eden. Growing up in a secular Jewish home, following a career as a rock music critic with a NYC newspaper, finding herself adrift in the culture of permissive self-expression, the author found her way to the Catholic Faith. She tells her story with striking candor and brave vulnerability.

Two Modern Classics . . .

Orthodoxy, by G. K. Chesterton. The most famous book of one of the most famous of the modern British "literary converts". This short, sparkling work is hard to describe. A man of genius tells us how he came to discover that the Christian Catholic Faith is true. It's the sort of book many people read once a year.

The Screwtape Letters: Letters from A Senior To a Junior Devil, by C. S. Lewis. Lewis, who had the rare gift of being both profound and popular, said that this book was his hardest of all to write because he had to think morally backwards. It is a brilliant, scary, sometimes funny exposé of the strategies of hell.

And One Novel . . .

The Keys of the Kingdom, by A. J. Cronin. The moving story of a Scottish Missionary – his trials, sacrifices, and joys—a sort of spiritual adventure story.

Have you thought about who your Confirmation Sponsor will be? Here are a few things to remember when choosing a sponsor. Your sponsor may be, but does not have to be your Godparent. Your sponsor must be a practicing Roman Catholic who has been fully initiated in the church (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist), attends Mass regularly (Sundays and Holy days of Obligation), is living according to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Your sponsor should be someone who supports you and your commitment to a Christian life. Your sponsor should be someone you can go to and talk to about your faith. Your sponsor should be someone you feel will support you and guide you in making decisions according to the faith. Think about why you want the person you are thinking about to be your Sponsor!

Why do we do service?

The Spirit moves us to imitate the love and service of Christ and the saints. In preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, we often perform many hours of service to help those in need. In doing so, we practice love and service in imitation of the saints whose names we often take at Confirmation. Anointed at Confirmation, we are further strengthened to live lives that five off "the aroma of Christ" as did the holy saints. (CCC, no. 1294). The sacred Chrism is mixed with fragrant spices precisely to symbolize this "aroma." The Holy Spirit pours love into our hearts so that we can become "instruments of grace" in order to "pour forth God's charity and to weave networks of charity" in the world (Pope Benedict XVI, Caritas in Veritate) Confirmation enriches the baptized with the strength of the Holy Spirit so that they can better witness to Christ in word and deed (Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC], no. 1285. Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 10, 2016 - Luke 10:25-37

(Jesus tells the story of the Good Samaritan in response to the scholar of the law who was testing Jesus. The scholar asked Jesus "who is my neighbor?" The man who fell victim to robbers in the story of the Good Samaritan is passed over by a priest and by a Levite, both of whom crossed to the opposite side of the road when they saw the beaten man.) "But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He poured oil and wine over the victim's wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him... 'Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim,' asks Jesus. The scholar answered, 'The one who treated him with mercy.' Jesus said, 'Go and do likewise.'"

Commentary:

Jesus does not need to answer the question of the "scholar" since the man already knows the answer. The issue is not knowing but doing, as Jesus instructs him "do this and you will live." Similarly, as the lawyer knew the law, we know this very familiar parable. The issue for us is not knowing the parable; rather, it is the hard work of extending mercy not just to the neighbor we know but to any person in need.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

The chief purpose of government is to protect life. Abandon that and you have abandoned all. Our country's chief purpose has been abandoned with the decriminalization of abortions and the use of tax dollars to pay for them.
