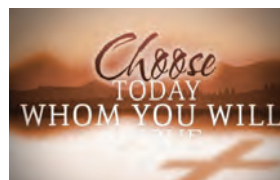


Total Parish Collection for September 11, 2016 was \$8,365.00 and 170 envelopes and online donors were recorded. As always, thank you for your generosity to our parish.

The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (No.84)

Fr. Phillip Johnson

A series of reflections about, professing, praying, thinking, and living the Faith of the Church

The Faith of Children

A young mother was pushing her shopping cart slowly down the long super market aisle, her toddler daughter ambling along behind—or so she thought. When she turned to speak to the child, she panicked a moment. But then she heard the familiar small voice sounding from the next aisle over: “Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name . . .”. The three-year old was having terrifying nightmares. Her distressed parents were doing their best to comfort her, when finally she said softly, “Oh well, just say ‘Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world’ and I’ll be O.K”. I could go on and on with such true stories that remind us of the religious and spiritual sensitivities of young children. You don’t have to “start from scratch” in the Christian education of a child. You do, however have to be vigilant, careful, and attentive so that the child’s inherent spiritual awareness is not blunted. Our Christian Catholic Faith is wise in these matters. Christianity alone among all religions has a particular theology of the Child. Jesus welcomed the children; he saw them in the light of their intrinsic relationship to God their Father.

You Are Being Watched. Children have a remarkable sensitivity to the values of their parents. “Christian education” begins with the Christian integrity of the parents and other beloved adults. Your religious and spiritual habits (or the lack of them) speak volumes to the child. The children are always watching, even when, especially when, you are not aware of being watched. And the home is the most important “class room” through the whole of your child’s life.

A Prayerful Vision of your Child: Praying for our children, we see them in a new light. We become more and more aware of the spiritual dignity of children. We see them in the light of Christ’s love. In prayer, we set the child at a holy distance, as the awareness grows in us that the child is a gift entrusted to us by the Author of Love. Praying for the child, it becomes only natural to pray with the child. Please don’t rob your child of the sound of your voice in prayer. Pray a simple form of the rosary, pray the Our Father, pray at waking, at meal times, at bed time, before long journeys

A Baptized Imagination: Read, read, read to you child. Read good books and don’t “dumb down” the stories. The experts teach us that children hear and take in words years before they speak them. Read the stories of the Gospel, the Old Testament stories of Creation, the Flood, Israel’s Exodus from Egypt. There are good children’s Bibles available. Read the stories of the great saints. Stories “baptize” the imagination, they feed the faith of the child, they make children aware of the spiritual narrative of their own life, of their real beginning in God, of their present life in God, of their promised End in God.

What To Do With a Baptized Baby: Bring the baby to mass. This will make for some hardships in your life. But the sacrifices will bear fruit in your child’s life. Remember, *the years between baptism and first communion are the most spiritually formative years.* The Liturgy is a powerful classroom – with music and song, the flow of language and story, communal recitation, color and movement. A young child often at mass soon becomes spiritually “acculturated” in the Christian community, as the child “drinks in” the faith of mother and father.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sept. 25, 2016 Luke 16: 19-31

Lazarus, covered with sores, lies at the doors of a rich man who ignores Lazarus' pleas for food. Both the rich man and Lazarus eventually die. Lazarus goes to heaven; the rich man goes to the netherworld. The rich man begs to have Lazarus come to him "to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue." Abraham replied to the rich man, "My child remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus received what was bad, but now he is comforted, while you are tormented. "

Commentary

This parable is blunt. How the rich man spends the afterlife was determined in this life by his lack of concern for the 'poor man lying at his door.' NOW is the time to bridge whatever chasms exist between us and those in need. After death, the divide is impassable, and our eternity is set. So, NOW is your time. Who is lying at your door?

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

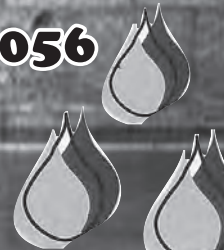
