Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 12, 2017 - Matthew 5:17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the Kingdom of heaven. "You have heard it said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill'...but I say to you, whoever is angry with brother or sister will be liable to judgment." "You have heard it said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery in his heart." "Your ancestors said, 'Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow.' But I say to you, do not swear at all."

Commentary:

One by one, Jesus takes the various laws in all their externality and draws out their inner roots. One injunction had been against killing. But the inside of that law is, do not ever act out of anger for your brother (or sister). Not even the word "raca" (vain, empty, worthless) may be spoken. You shall not commit adultery. The inside of that law is, be pure enough to not even look lustfully at a woman. And, divorce. The interior law is to stay faithful and loving within your marriage relationship. Finally, the matter of oaths and swearing. Jesus diagnoses this simply: you are trying to make up for your weakness by putting almighty power behind your words. Just say yes or no, and mean it. Why does Jesus dig so deep? The inside of the law is written in Jesus' heart. May it be written in ours as well.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



Lord, send forth Your Holy Spirit to guide this new administration in America. May they lead with love and compassion for all citizens. Through Your guidance, may they return to the founding principles of this country. May they defend life at all stages, may they rule once again that all have the right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

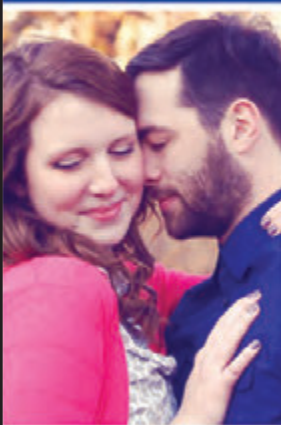
