### Stewardship Reflection: First Sunday of Lent



The best purpose of all is one where we give ourselves away for others without any thought of reward.

*“It is written: the Lord, your God shall you worship, Him alone shall you serve.”*  
*Matthew 4:10*

Tempted between the riches and power of this world, and service to God, Jesus chose service to His Father. If we wish to truly follow Jesus, we, too, must decide to turn away from power and riches and put God at the center of our lives. How is God calling you to serve?

## LENTEN REGULATIONS 2017

**Abstinence from meat:** All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain totally from meat on the following days: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

**Fasting:** All Catholics between the ages of 19 and 59 are bound also to observe the Law of Fast on the following days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting, that is eating less, involves limiting oneself to a full meal and avoiding food between meals. Lighter nourishment may be taken on two other occasions in the course of the day.

**Prayer & Penance:** The entire season of Lent should be observed in a spirit of prayer and penance. Spending extra time in prayer (such as the Rosary or Stations of the Cross) or Bible study, attending daily Mass or Eucharistic Adoration, voluntary sacrifice and self-denial, combined with works of charity and service to others, are all excellent ways to obey the Lord's command to reform our lives and to prepare for the joyful celebration of Easter.

**Easter Duty:** All Catholics who have reached the age of reason must confess their serious sins in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year. They must also receive Holy Communion at least once during the Easter season, which this year extends from March 5th, the first Sunday of Lent, until Trinity Sunday, June 11th.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

**Excerpt from the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Lent, March 12, 2017 - Matthew 17:1-9**

Jesus took Peter, James, and John, his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And He was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. A bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

**Commentary:**

Jesus looks very different to his friends on the mountaintop. What has changed: his outward appearance, or their ability to see Jesus clearly? Sometimes, miracles are in the eye of the beholder, or perhaps more accurately in the heart. We think we know what's going on around us, but a shift in perspective can make all the difference in what we actually perceive. When his friends look at Jesus on this occasion, they literally see the light. What about us? Do we see the pain in a co-worker's or family member's face? Only if we want to. Are we sensitive to racism, sexism, and prejudice of every kind? If we pay attention. Do we participate in and benefit from systems of injustice? If we open our eyes and our minds, we can find plenty of evidence in our lifestyles to support this conclusion. Our ability to see has a lot to do with how much light is admitted to the eyes. If we close our eyes to things we'd rather not see, our vision of the world and ourselves may be more comforting, but increasingly unreal

**Questions for Reflection and Sharing:**

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

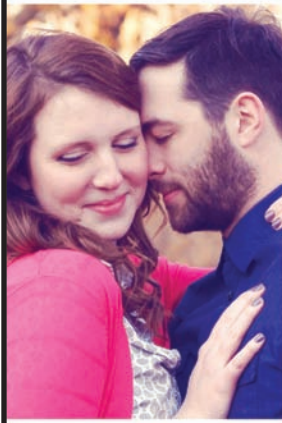
