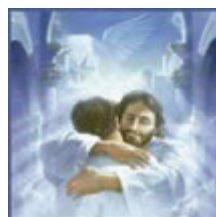

Holidays and Holydays

Holy Leisure . . .

Holidays derive from holy days. For many generations in Western societies it has been taken for granted that people ought not to have to show up for work on Sundays and other designated holy days. If the Catholic philosopher Josef Pieper is right (in *Leisure the Basis of Culture*), the very concept of leisure has its origins in ancient pagan religious festival. Honoring the gods meant sharing in their privileged repose.

Of course, work is essential, and work can be holy. But having to work long hours for money, for our basic needs, or for luxuries that have become needs, is now imposing on people an endless “fasting” from rest. In a religious context, one fasts in order to prepare for the feast; one works in order to rest. In the growing secular culture of “total work,” one rests only in order to “get back to work”. The once popular proverb is rarely quoted these days: “All work and no play makes Jack a dull boy.”

The historical origin of the American Thanksgiving Holiday is explicitly religious. There is no religious timidity in the language of the several thanksgiving proclamations issued by our Presidents, from George Washington's 1789 declaration to Abraham Lincoln's 1863 institution of our present yearly holiday. What Americans like to call our “First Thanksgiving” of 1621 is deeply set in the American memory, when 53 pilgrims, joined by 90 native Americans, celebrated a three day feast to give thanks to God for the first harvest in their new homeland.

Eucharistia: Keeping the Holiday Holy . . .

Thanks Giving Day is a national holiday, and as such a family-and-friends holiday. It is not a Church- instituted holiday. Nevertheless, the Catholic Church in the United States joyfully joins in the celebration, approving the deeply human religious impulse to stop and give thanks. In this the Church enriches the culture of our nation, helping to sustain that religious impulse. Because, as is now obvious, it is possible for a holiday to go on and on even as the religious impulse dies, as people stop to give thanks, but with little thought of the One to whom we owe thanks.

The Catholic Church, with other Christian communities, gathers to *name* the Giver, the Lord of seedtime and harvest, the Giver of life itself, the Providence that governs the history of all nations. The Catholic Church speaks the Name of the Giver. Not just “God” or “Supreme Being” – the terms with which our present day civic religion must make do – but God the Father with his Son Jesus Christ, dwelling eternally in the communion of their shared Holy Spirit. The Church is an expert in such holidays. *Eucharistia* (Greek for “thanksgiving”) is the name of the Church's chief act of gathering.

I hope your Thanksgiving Holiday will be full of family sharing and feasting, laughter and leisure. Most importantly, I hope we may all enjoy with ever deepening gratitude the holy leisure offered us, as we repose in God's grace, in the Church's perpetual holiday: *Eucharistia*.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week’s Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ the King, Nov 26, 2017 - Matt. 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: “When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.”

Commentary:

Today’s description of the last judgment goes further than any other. This final judgment determines what counts in the end. It is not success or how perfectly a person has developed. In the end, the judgment is about love for the poorest, the no-accounts, the ones easy to miss. It is not about doing good or charitable things for a cause or out of a sense of duty. What counts is doing real practical good out of genuine love. Jesus tells us that when we do this, we are serving Jesus himself.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
