# The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (no. 114)

Fr. Phillip Johnson

Professing, Praying, Thinking, and Living the Faith of the Church

## Virtues

A virtue is a developed moral habit, a disposition, an internalized power to live well. Among all the virtues, there are seven that are utterly foundational for the Christian life.

**The Four Cardinal Virtues** are known by the natural law written on the human heart. The Church adopts Aristotle's treatment, deepening his understanding with Christian wisdom.

### PRUDENCE

Perhaps the most ignored and misunderstood of all the virtues. Not the fear of risk, not timidity in moral action, certainly not prudishness. Prudence is the wisdom to look reality in the face, to recognize the good that must be done in every circumstance and the right way to do it, not overdoing or under-doing.

### JUSTICE

Living in right relationship with God, others, and oneself. To know what one owes to others, always giving them their due. The old English word for "Justice" is "righteousness".

### FORTITUDE

Firmness and constancy in doing the good, when doing the good is difficult and costly. St. Thomas Aquinas says the highest form of courage is not the one dramatic heroic act, but the quiet endurance in suffering for the good.

### TEMPERANCE

Moderation, balance, the art of using all the good things of creation as they are meant to be used. The avoidance of all addictive enslavement to the pleasures.

**The Three Theological Virtues** are known, not by natural law, but by divine revelation. These virtues are given by God's grace but must be actively sought and humbly received.

### FAITH

The habit of opening the intelligence to the revealed truth of God that comes to us in his Word. By faith we live always in confident trust in God's love and truth

### HOPE

The knowledge of our true *end* in God, our eternal destiny; and the confidence that God will achieve that blessed end, so that we never despair in the trials of this life.

### CHARITY

The goal of all virtues (1 Cor. 13). Not only acts of mercy, but the love of God as Jesus teaches us, with all our mind, heart, and strength; and loving others as ourselves. Not so much a feeling as *generous good will*.

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for Fifth Sunday of Easter, April 29, 2018 - John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower... Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit because without me you can do nothing."

#### Commentary:

The demands of being Christ's disciples are evident: we are told five times that we must "bear fruit." There is only one way to do this: by a relationship with Jesus so close and so intimate that we remain in him like a branch on a vine. Only his life in us enables us to bear fruit.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

## Building our Church NOW and for the FUTURE

### **House of Charity– Bishop's Annual Appeal**

The House of Charity provides the day-to-day operational income that supports the pastoral, charitable and social ministries of the Diocese including Catholic Charities, support for seminarian education and housing for retired priests, support for Vitality Healthcare Services, support for Catholic education as well as support for our various pastoral ministries.

The House of Charity– Bishop's Annual Appeal supports people to people ministries that serve the South Jersey community today. In service, we encounter those in need where they are, accompany them on their journey and bring them to a place of hope.

Monies that are raised in this fiscal year are expended next fiscal year. Without the House of Charity, the Diocese could not fulfill the mission that Christ gave us to care for His people.

### **Catholic Strong Campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey**

Of the funds raised through the Catholic Strong campaign, 70% will remain at the parish. There is no single case statement because each parish has been asked to identify their unique needs and the way they will put their dollars to use. These needs could include updates to physical plant needs, new or expanded youth and pastoral ministries, and the hiring of staff to expand the effectiveness of parishes. Whatever the individual case, each parish has had the opportunity to identify their own needs and how they would like to spend the dollars raised to meet those needs.

At the same time, 30% of the dollars raised will be returned to the Diocese for use in creating new religious education, addiction support, and other ministries that cannot be supported by current funding sources. In addition, new evangelization efforts will be established to reach out to non-Catholics, people living on the fringes of our society, and to those who have left the faith.
