Catholic Strong is a campaign that owes much of its theme to Pope Francis' call on all of us to become Missionary Disciples. This concept he first broached in his 2013 Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* (*The Joy of the Gospel*).



“The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept His offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew. In this Exhortation I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come.”

From there he tasked us to do more, to welcome more, to embrace more by becoming missionary disciples. “‘I dream of a 'missionary option,' that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation.’”

The Catholic Strong campaign, has at its core an emphasis on evangelization, to bring back those Catholics who have fallen away and to inspire non-Catholics to join us in a faith that is enthusiastic and joyful.

Through your support, we will create in both our parishes and the diocese new programs and initiatives to evangelize to all who wish to find a home in our South Jersey Catholic community.

Stewardship Reflection: Pentecost Sunday

All of us are blessed, regardless of our own individual circumstances; God has given each of us many gifts.

How we use those gifts is our gift back to God. For God's plan to work, each must do what we are called to do—and—guess what— we are not all called to do the same thing!

“Called to be Fully Alive in Christ”

Explore an ancient tool, the Enneagram, that provides understanding of our humanity. Developed by Christian and Sufi mystics, it has been used for generations to help persons grow into spiritual maturity.

Since the 1970’s, psychologists and spiritual directors have expanded the understanding of this tool and have shared it with the world through books and workshops.

Sister Eileen Smith, RSM, Director of Mount Saint Mary House of Prayer, will share about the wisdom of this tool in three sessions and how it can assist us in understanding our gifts and limitations and how it can help us in our prayer so that we can become more “fully alive in Christ”.

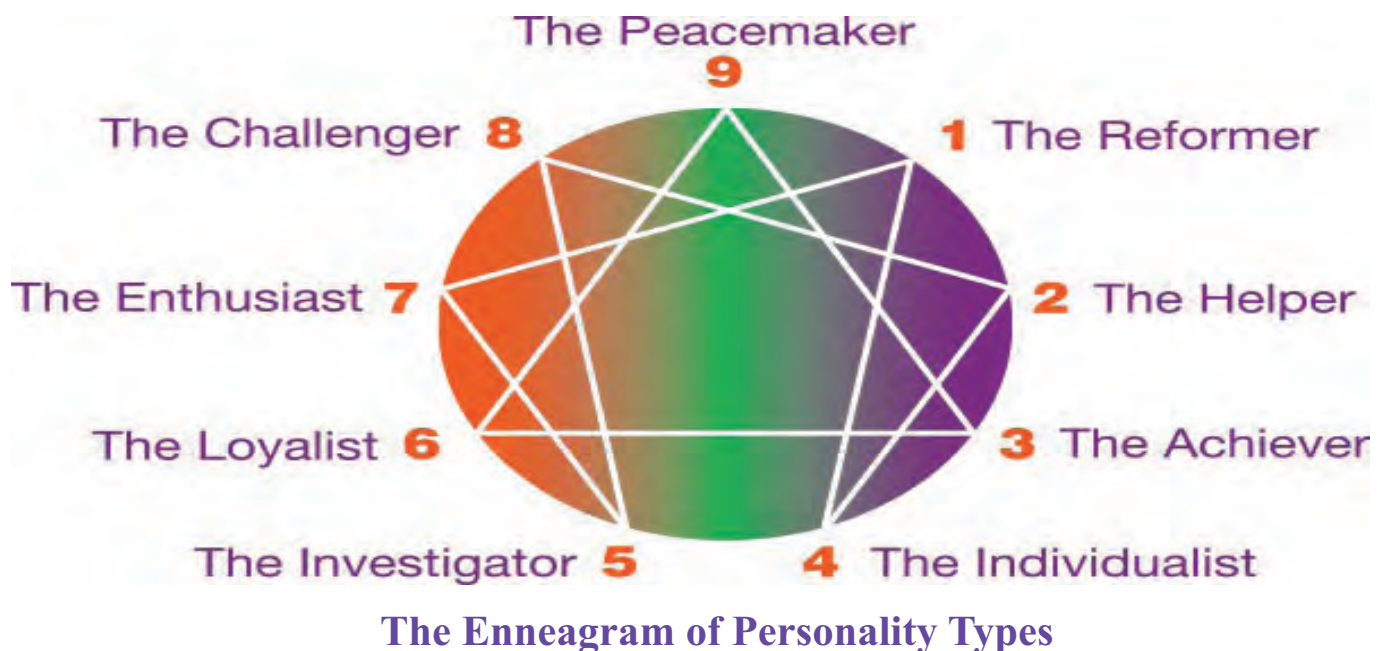

Silence is almost scary as we are so used to noise and the constant social media interruptions. When the richness of silence becomes known to us we begin to seek it, desire it and treasure

it. Those of us working with children have noticed how they actually enjoy some quiet time, especially in front of the Blessed Sacrament. Prayer needs to be a daily practice in families so that children learn to pray together. Some planned silence to read or reflect would be a way for them to get in touch with JESUS and actually experience HIS presence. What a positive effect that would have on their life!

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for Trinity Sunday, May 27, 2018 – Matt 28:16-20

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Commentary:

Matthew tells us that the apostles now recognize Jesus in his risen life and they worship him. Jesus drew near to them as he always draws near to humankind. Having formed them as his disciples, he now sends them forth in turn to make disciples of all nations. They are to baptize people in such a way that they will be seen as sons and daughters of God. The trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – describes an experience of the one, true God who creates, liberates and makes holy. Into this God, a community of persons, we are plunged by our Baptism.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
