What to do in Adoration?

1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours. Whether you are praising, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness or seeking an answer, you'll find an appropriate psalm. The ancient prayer of the Church called the Liturgy of the Hours presents an excellent way to pray through the book of Psalms throughout the year.
2. Recite the “Jesus Prayer” Say “Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner,” repeatedly as you quiet your heart and mind.

Adoration is held every Friday in the Chapel after the 9:00 am Mass until 12 Noon. All are encouraged to take part.

For Our Children

Religious Education classes are closed and will resume in September.

Registration forms for 2018-19 were **emailed** to families. They are also available on the parish's website, stthomasmorenj.org

Children who are being registered for first grade need to provide proof of Baptism unless baptized here at St. Thomas More.

New or transferring families need to register in the parish and at the same time the children may be registered for RE, using the appropriate form, and providing the Baptism and other sacramental certificates for the child/children as well as transfer documents from the previous parish. For more information stop by or call the RE office during the day 8-2, Monday to Thursday. Closed Friday

The preparation for the Sacraments requires a two-year formation. Attending first grade is thus a pre-requisite before entering second grade and prepare and receive the sacraments of First Penance and Eucharist. The same is said for the seventh grade which is followed by eighth grade and Confirmation.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 8, 2018 - Mark 6:1-6a

Jesus came to his native place. When the Sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. They said, "Where did this man get all this?...Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary...And they took offense at him. Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there...He was amazed at their lack of faith.

Commentary:

Standing in the tradition of the great prophets of old, Jesus announces God's word. In his hometown Jesus confronts the scandal, rejection, and lack of faith on the part of those who presume to know him. Nevertheless, whether heeded or resisted, Jesus will remain faithful to his mission.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

Why do we need a major Fundraising campaign?

At the time of the mergers and consolidations of parishes in the Diocese, it was believed that the majority of our parishes, because of efficiencies of right-sizing and the sale of property, would become operationally stable and prepared to meet ongoing physical plant and maintenance needs. Unfortunately, as a result of the "great recession" of 2008, many parishes in the Diocese of Camden have been struggling financially. Most are able to meet their day-to-day operational expenses, but few are ready to deal with major physical plant needs. Therefore 70% of all funds collected will go directly to the parish to meet their own unique needs.

Each parish family in the Diocese of Camden will be asked to consider making a gift to the campaign. This campaign is conducted in a phased approach so that each member is reached at the appropriate time and manner. While not all members will be able to give at the same level, each will be asked to make a sacrificial commitment.
