Our collection for April 28, 2019, was \$ 6,527.00 from 144 donations. Thank you for your continuing generosity to our parish.

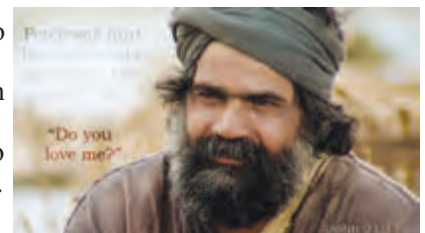

This is always a cause for rejoicing.

Hopefully they have felt the presence of the Spirit and embrace the journey ahead with their children, to grow in FAITH, to celebrate further with JESUS and the parish community. With time, the danger lurks to pull us back to the old ways. We must not let that happen. As we look at the readings of today, the Third Sunday of Easter, we see Peter and the disciples

going back fishing. Probably it wasn't just a return to the old way, but a needed for sustenance and "fishing" was their trait. The leaders of the JEWS were still in the old way, with no intent of picking up the message of the Resurrection. And they make it very difficult for the Disciple to speak about JESUS being alive. But PETER makes a proclamation: "We need to listen to God rather than men". The "going back to the old ways" is always a temptation, yet the only alternative God gives us is to move "forward", in newness of life every day, trusting in God's presence and goodness.

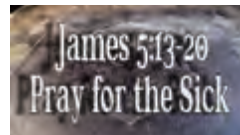

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Easter, May 5 – John 10: 27-30

Jesus said: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

Commentary:

Consider the folks who have led you to become who you are today: family members and first teachers, mentors and heroes, friends, and maybe a few enemies along the way. You may have followed the inspiration of an idea or a dream, or received your greatest encouragement from people you only met in books or learned about from history. In ways we may scarcely be aware of, we have also been led by the small, still voice of our Creator, calling us to a greater and fuller life. If we have been raised in the Christian tradition, we also have been listening to the good news of Jesus Christ down through the years. Though we may stray after our demons from time to time, we can always find our way back to the center if we listen for the voice of Jesus. He calls us to our most authentic selves and tells us who we really are. Even when we are out finding ourselves, we are already found in his hands.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?



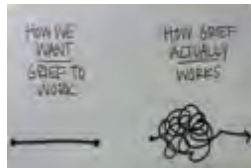
