CHANGE and WAITING

Advent is about waiting and changing. The Sacred Scriptures of this holy season have a loud clamor to wait and to change. And without a doubt, all of us want to change. We know that it is only by embracing change can we touch the center of the Advent season. At the same time, deep-down, inside, the challenge is: *'how much are we really willing to fundamentally change?'*

The clients who come to my office for spiritual direction or for therapy say they want to change. But they just don't know how to change. They are often afraid to change. They feel stuck. They feel stagnant. Change is threatening for them. They feel impotent to change. They don't feel strong enough to embrace and sustain innovations in their lifestyles.

Some think it is better to sit tight than try to improve their relationship with God or with themselves and others. They feel impossibly mired in a chronic condition of addiction or some other chronic repetitive self-defeating pattern.

These clients feel so stuck and trapped in their patterns that they don't believe they can change. They don't believe that profound change is even possible. They fear that even if somehow they manage to change it cannot be sustained.

At the same time, deep down in their souls they know that some reorganization or transformation must take place at the core of their beings. On the one hand they want to change, but then on the other hand they wonder why they have to change. So, for many, anchoring real change seems as illusive as running the Philadelphia marathon.

Advent is very much about letting go of bad habits. It is about letting go of our negative beliefs. It is about letting go of our frozen emotional patterns. Are we willing to be liberated from our chronic patterns of warped thinking, feeling, acting and interacting?

Unless we change our distorted beliefs, we are powerless to full blown change. We need to unleash the self-defeating beliefs. We can benefit from dislodging the beliefs that are woven into the bedrock of our conditioning that probably began in childhood.

Advent says loudly to us that stagnation is not an option. The luxury of being fearful and stuck is over. Embrace the opportunity to be born anew. There is no choice but to change. Neither can the ego be smugly satisfied with superficial change.

The higher self, or the spiritual self, requires that we change anything that interferes with our ability to reflect on His first coming in the flesh; our ability to reflect on His second coming at the end of time; and our ability to reflect on His daily coming into our lives.

Advent is centered on the moment we issue an intention to change. That is when the Divine energy is set in motion to bring about transformational change in our lives. Surely, persisting and attending to the call to change is at the core of the Advent season.

Change is what the spiritual life is about. Changing often is at the heart of the spiritual path. We cannot change other people. But we can work with the Divine to change ourselves. With our cooperation, change will come to us with grace and with discipline.

It is then that we realize that Advent says Christ is coming to us each day. *Christ is coming to us here and now. Christ is coming to us on the job. Christ is coming to us at school. Christ is coming to us in the midst of our dealings with the people we like and dislike. Christ is coming to the poor, the rich, the old and the lonely.*

We believe that God is at work in us. We are in the hands of God. God is shaping us. That requires our response and our willingness to constant change. We are called to remain open to God's grace and energy. Then, with our change of heart, we can grow. Our hearts can enlarge and stretch. Our vision can expand and swell. *We can say, 'Come, Lord Jesus!'*

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Advent, December 11, 2011 - John 1:6-8, 19-28

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light...When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" he admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ."..."I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, make straight the way of the Lord, as Isaiah the prophet said." "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."

Commentary:

This reading tells the same story as the last two Sundays. Last week, we got the story of John the Baptist's ministry from Mark, and this week's passage is from the gospel of John. If you compare the two stories, you'll immediately see the parallels and also be conscious of the differences. In the distinctions, we often find the reason why the second story is told. Mark, who was writing a generation after the time of Jesus, was anxious to introduce us to the character of John, his ministry and who he was as a pivotal figure in salvation history. But in John's gospel, written in the second or third generation after Jesus, it was more important to tell who John the Baptist was not, for those who might experience some confusion on the subject. Most of the followers of John remained faithful to him even after Jesus appeared on the scene, and we know John's sect stayed active long after his death. For those who didn't understand that John willingly "decreased" so that Jesus could "increase," this story sets the record straight."

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
