COMMUNAL RECONCILIATION SERVICE

Monday, December 12, 2011 - 7:30 PM At Saint Thomas More Parish

Through Baptism we become the adopted sons and daughters of God. Baptism connects our lives with Christ forever. We live in Him and He lives in us. As a family we try to deepen our relationship with Christ every day.

We are all very aware that we can wander away from the right path of life. We wander away from family life and life in the world as it is supposed to be. We can wander away from God. We envy the talents of others. We never discover our own. We get involved with evil.

We have family conflicts and family wars. We have national and international wars. War destroys everything. People are killed. Millions are starving and millions die. Creation is ripped apart. We sin and we need Jesus to save us. We need to go to Confession. We need to soak up the mercy and goodness of God.

Sin is real. Sin is ugly. Sin is toxic. Sin is a virus in healthy living. Sin is harmful. Sin is hurtful. Sin is pride. Sin is greed. Sin is envy. Sin is lust. Sin is anger. Sin is resentment. Sin is war. Sin is hatred. Sin is racism. Sin is violence of all kinds. Sin is personal. Sin is communal. Sin brings misery. Sin brings pain. Sin brings unhappiness. Sin brings loss.

We are all wounded emotionally and spiritually by sin of one kind or another. We are weakened emotionally and spiritually. And we believe that the great medicine for us Catholics is the sacrament of RECONCILIATION. The experience of this sacrament communally can heal our spiritual illnesses and uplift our emotional and spiritual conditions.

Jesus spends much time during his public ministry on forgiving sinners. Jesus wants to forgive us. Jesus wants to set us free. Jesus wants a better life for us. Jesus has no interest in condemning us. Giving forgiveness is very much at the heart of Jesus ministry.

To really experience Jesus forgiveness and God's unconditional love is very therapeutic. To taste God's absolute goodness and mercy in the sacrament of reconciliation can be a wonderful source of comfort and peace for all of us.

It is God's absolute and constant love and mercy that pardons our sins. It is God's forever and infinite love that pardons our sins and heals our souls. God's grace is an unearned gift that is given in abundance in the sacrament of reconciliation.

God's grace is more powerful than sin. God's love is more powerful than sin. God's goodness is infinitely stronger than our sins. All we have to do is acknowledge, admit and ask for forgiveness. In this way we are strengthened to grow in goodness and are ruled by grace.

Our sin never affects us alone. Your whole family, our whole faith community is damaged and weakened by our personal sins. We acknowledge this when we hold our communal celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation for all parishioners of our area parishes on this coming MONDAY EVENING, DECEMBER 12th at 7:30 PM.

Please come Monday evening at 7:30 PM. You too can benefit from experiencing the goodness and mercy of God. You are teaching and you are modeling well when you join with others and go to CONFESSION and celebrate the sacrament of God's infinite mercy.

Give yourself the gift of experiencing the mercy and forgiveness of God in the context of the sacrament of reconciliation. There will be about ten priests available on Monday evening. So there will not be a long wait. You will be home in a reasonable time.

I look forward to seeing you on Monday evening at Saint Thomas More Church. May all of you and your loved ones have a blessed and holy Christmas Season.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, December 18, 2011 - Luke 1:26-38

...Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

Commentary:

In today's first reading, David takes the initiative in providing God a suitable dwelling place among the chosen people. By contrast, in the gospel, it is God who takes the initiative in establishing a divine dwelling place in Mary and among us. What humans would confine to stones and mortar, God plants in human flesh and blood.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

- 1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
- 2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
- 3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
