LENTEN JOURNEY from Darkness to Light

As I write this reflection the sun is shining and the ground holds the promise of daffodils and tulips and all kinds of new life in the spring.

The word *Lent* is an old English word meaning springtime. It is a time of new life. It is a time of new growth. It is a sacred time. It is a time of grace. It is a time of preparation for Easter. It is a time to ready ourselves for the greatest event in human history.

The Sacred Scriptures of Lent are filled to overflowing capacity with practical spiritual concepts. Daily they challenge us to learn more about ourselves. They challenge us to do some inner working and inner looking and inner cleansing. They challenge us to shine a lighted torch on the inner **darkness** that casts a shadow on our lives and on our relationships.

This is a season to look inward and see the **darkness**. The darkness can be anything that interferes with an authentic relationship with *self*; an authentic relationship with *others*; an authentic relationship with *God*. This threefold relationship is a central part of the Christian life. To have difficulty with anyone of the three is to have difficulty with each of the others.

The causes and the sources of our **darkness** are varied. The causes can vary from personality to personality. However, the most common darkness that most often interferes with the threefold relationship can be unresolved painful moments of our childhoods and adolescents. There are feelings that come from real or imagined hurt and rejection. These feelings can come from real or perceived neglect and misunderstanding. Sometimes they come from prolonged conflict, abuse or abandonment.

Many people are ensnared in the **darkness** of unresolved and unhealed wounds from childhood and from adolescence. They carry these wounds into adult life. They almost seem to nurse them. They have become vessels of negative forces. They are filled with anger and hostility. They don't know it. And in their lack of awareness they are unable to take responsibility for their denied injuries and negativity.

When people start thinking about **darkness** they often think it is out there. They talk about wars and racism. They see injustices and neglect. They see what people do to each other. They see what nations do to each other. They don't see the darkness within. They don't want to look within at their own judgments, entitlements and their own hostilities. It is too difficult and too threatening and too tough a job to look inward and see the darkness within.

When people are unaware of the **darkness** in their lives it is easy for them to project their negativity out and violate others. They violate boundaries and respect. They attempt to create secrets and bindings to justify their beliefs. They start to project their inner darkness outward rather than accept it as something that is within them.

Those living in **darkness** will often spray out gobs of negative past life debris onto a spouse or a friend or an employee or a co-worker. It can happen to in-laws or to neighbors. The whole world becomes a big ghost for their unconscious stuff. A blizzard of toxins can be propelled and sprayed everywhere.

When we start to look at the **darkness** within, we are humbled. We see our flaws and it can open our hearts. We shed the mask. We meet the truth. We face everything. We face what is crippling us and haunting us. We confess and we ask for forgiveness. We begin to open up to ourselves, others and God.

The **light** begins to shine when we stop projecting our negativity outward. This leads to a passionate acceptance of the self. It helps us realize that we have a lot in common with everyone else. It leads us to awaken to a space that is beyond our personalities. It leads to accepting *all* of ourselves. It leads to the acceptance of others including our God.

That journey from **darkness** to **light** is at the heart of the Lenten journey. It is at the heart of our hope in the Resurrection.

Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Palm Sunday, April 1, 2012 - Mark, Chapters 14 and 15

"While they were eating, Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many..." {pause} "While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the high priest's maids came along. Seeing Peter warming himself, she looked intently at him and said, "You too were with the Nazarene, Jesus." But he denied it saying, "I neither know nor understand what you are talking about..." {pause} Pilate questioned Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus said to him in reply, "You say so."

Commentary:

Apostles, who should know who Jesus is, betray, deny, and flee. Ironically, it is from enemies and foreigners that we come to understand who Jesus is: the religious leaders ask Jesus if he is "the Christ, the son of the Blessed One"; Pilate condemns him as the "king of the Jews"; the Roman centurion confesses that "Truly this man is the Son of God." As we stand this day at the foot of the cross, whom do we see?

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?

Stewardship Reflection

Title: Living Stewardship

"I will be their God and they shall be my people." (Jeremiah 31:33b)

What does it mean to be God's people? It means that first we recognize that everything we have and everything we are truly belongs to God. It also means that we are willing to live in **Stewardship** by using our gifts and our lives to care for the world just as God cares for us.
