Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Seventh Sunday of Easter, May 8, 2016 - John 17:20-26

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed, saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me.

Commentary:

This passage, known as the Unity Prayer was prayed by Jesus at the Last Supper. Jesus was praying for you and for me. As Jesus saw it, the best last scenario for the human race is unity. As incredible as it sounds, Jesus desires for us the same total communion with God that he enjoys as "God from God, light from light." This is the final prayer of Jesus for his church both present and future until the end of time as we know it. We live in a world torn by violence and selfishness. It seems almost too wonderful to imagine the vision Jesus has for us. However, "unity" is Jesus' "end of the world" goalpost. Could there be a better one?

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Commentary resonates with me?

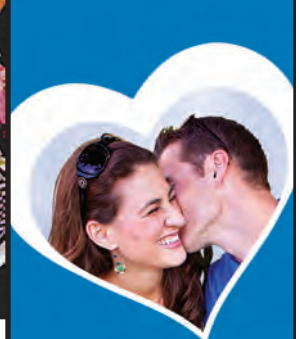
