Reflections about professing, praying, thinking, and living the Faith of the Church

## Mary, Mother of God

*Called in the Gospels “mother of Jesus,” Mary is acclaimed by Elizabeth, at the prompting of the Spirit, and even before the birth of Mary’s son, as “the mother of my Lord” (Lk. 2:43). In fact, the One whom she conceived as man by the Holy Spirit, who truly became her son according to the flesh, was none other than the Father’s eternal Son, the second person of the Holy Trinity. Hence the Church confesses that Mary is truly “Mother of God” (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 499).*

The title, *Theotokos* (“God Bearer) was officially promulgated at the Council of Ephesus in 649. But like many conciliar declarations, the fathers of the council were simply confirming the established practice of the Church east and west. The council was simply following the logic of the Church’s faith in Jesus Christ as *truly God and truly man*. For, as the Catechism makes clear, “what the Catholic faith believes about Mary is based on what it believes about Christ, and what it teaches about Mary illumines in turn its faith in Christ” (no. 47).

This explains how it is that Lutheran, Anglican, and Presbyterian communities have always joined the Catholic Church in affirming this Marian title (even if, generally speaking, their liturgical rites are marked by a Marian minimalism). It was and is only those who do not affirm that Jesus is truly Son of God that are unable to speak of Mary as Mother of God.

How is it that the Church’s meditation on the divine motherhood of Mary “illumines . . . its faith in Christ”? First of all, Mary’s role opens the eyes of faith to the unfathomable humility of God, the Father who sends to us his eternal Son who, through Mary, take to himself our humanity. “The Father of mercies willed that the Incarnation should be preceded by assent of the chosen God Bearer” (Vat. II).

But to speak of the revelation of God’s “lowliness” is to speak of the revelation of the God’s love. And to speak of the love of the incarnate Son of God is to speak of the love of his human mother. For motherhood is not simply a biological role, not only an act of “reproduction”. Motherhood is, by its created nature a calling forth, a new origination, of love—love of the mother for her child and the child for the mother. In the womb, the reality of loves is already present. In the first moments after birth, the child will “search” for love. The child will not have to “learn” to love the mother. The mother and child simply “answer” to the love of the other.

As fully human, the baby Jesus will “reach” for love—love given, love received, love prepared—human love destined to be perfected by the divine Love. If there was to be the Incarnation, there had to be the *Mother* of God.

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for The Epiphany of the Lord, January 8, 2017 - Matthew 2:1-12

“And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the Child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the Child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.”

#### Commentary:

All of us are following one star or another across our lives. Maybe it's a dream of the person we want to be. Maybe it's the fantasy of a person who will love us the way we are. The star we follow may be fame and fortune, or peace and security. Chances are, we will find the star we are looking for but in many cases, it won't be what we thought it was and the results may be disappointing. The one star that did not disappoint is the one that led the magi to Jesus. Like most of us traveling in the dark, these men had no idea where their journey would take them or what it might cost once they arrived at their destination. They were prepared to sacrifice wealth, time, and their comfortable security, nonetheless. And when they found their hearts' desire, they were overjoyed at the discovery. Like Moses, they too became radiant at what they saw. We can imagine they took that radiance home with them, so that everyone who saw them wondered at the change.

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
