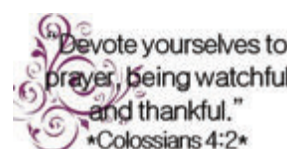

# The Catholic Faith In Slow Motion (no. 107)

## ***The Second Advent***

We enter the season of Advent, perhaps the most counter-cultural of the liturgical seasons. While the world around us frantically launches the commercial season earlier and earlier, the Church slows down, entering a time of prayerful *waiting* and spiritual preparation. And the first announcement of Advent is not the coming of the Christ Child but the final coming of the risen Lord. “*He will come to judge the living and the dead*”. We prepare for Christmas by preparing for the end of the world! As the child “just can't wait” for the coming of Christmas morning, so it is that child-like faith longs for the final advent of Jesus.

*Longing for the unimaginable . . .*

But can we really learn such longing? Can we learn to honestly pray with the first generation of Christians, “*Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!*” Why would we long for the end of the world as we know it? Because the “end of the world,” according to the promise of Christ, will bring the fulfillment of our true *End*, our true destiny, our ever new beginning. It will bring the vindication of love, the redeeming of every hidden act of love seemingly buried in obscurity. Truth will finally shine and falsehood be exposed; unfairness will be righted. Those who have kept faith through suffering, terror, and ridicule will be honored. Those who have sown the seeds of violence, hatred, and godlessness will face the truth or be banished. The humble will be surprised by their exaltation; the loveless shocked by the embrace of Love. Whatever is good in us will be perfected; whatever is evil in us, purged away. We will at last know the joy of being all we are meant to be. Our children and all God's little ones will then be loved as they ought to be loved. In this *End* – and this will surely be the highlight of heaven and the summary of all joy—the Crucified One will finally get all the credit, finally be adored as he deserves. And God will be everything to every one” (1 Cor. 15:28).

*A fearful hope, a hopeful fear . . .*

But “*He will come to judge. . .*”. Is this promise of the End not a terrifying threat? Indeed, “It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God” (Heb. 10:31). In the Christian life, in this mean time of our waiting, hope and fear dwell together, and one does not banish the other. Because judgment means not only vindication, “passing judgment”. Judgment means a sorting out, a separation, one on this side, the other on that side, acceptance or rejection, a final either – or (Matt. 25:31-46).

This holy fear is in the service of God's grace. It finally gives us courage to repent. It teaches us to accept *now* God's right to judge, to willingly stand ahead of time in the search light of God's judgment (the confessional!). For we all have in us that which must be separated out and “discarded” for the sake of our true End (1 John 1:10). After all, we cannot enter heaven half-heartedly. As we acknowledge our sins and cast ourselves on God's mercy, fear bows before hope. Finally, “love casts out fear”—not our imperfect love of God, but God's perfect love for us in Jesus Christ (1 John 4:10, 18). God's judgment, humbly accepted, drives us under the shelter of the Cross. This is our hope, that *He*, the Crucified One is our judge; our End is in the hands of Sacrificial Love.

Pope Francis, keenly sensitive to the plight of victims of persecution, warfare, famine visited Myanmar and Bangladesh this week. It is important to know that even now many people in the world have to leave their home, run for their lives, become refugee, without a country, and unaccounted persons, without identity. It is a horrific reality that **“ethnic cleansing” is still a practice today in some areas of the world. Religious persecution is still going on. In areas of Iraq, Syria, countries in Africa, hundreds of thousands of Christians were martyred in the last decade, and every day martyrdom continues for their FAITH.** These things should make us feel uncomfortable. We wish we could do something concrete and feel so helpless. A change of heart is the place to start. How grateful am I for all I have received in my life? How free am I from the compulsions of the holiday rush? Is God really at the top of my life? Do I make time for personal prayer and communal worship or do I put God off to the edge? How much room do I give to relativism to effect the moral fiber in my decision making? Are we teaching our children to be appreciative, to be respectful? What role models do we adults set for them? How much are we world changers vs. status quo maintainers? The Liturgical Season of Advent offers good starting points for a true change of heart.

## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 3, 2017

### Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

#### Excerpt from the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Advent, December 10, 2017 - Mark 1:1-8

John the Baptist appeared in the desert proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins...This is what John proclaimed: "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

#### Commentary:

Like John we must be voices crying out to prepare the way of the Lord. Salvation is already upon us. What we are doing now is critical, as critical as what John the Baptist was doing to announce Jesus' first coming. The way we live our lives makes a difference, not only for our own salvation but also because - since we have been baptized in the Holy Spirit and already share in God's divine life - we are to announce God's reign to others. The role of John the Baptist is transferred to us: what John was to Christ's first coming we are to be to Christ's Second Coming. And we prepare for this Second Coming by living our lives in such a way that we are "without spot or blemish before him, at peace" (second reading).

#### Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
