As you may have heard, a major campaign is underway at St. Thomas More Parish. **Catholic Strong**, the Campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey, is seeking to secure a minimum of \$50 million, which will primarily benefit our local parishes. Seventy percent of the funds raised through this effort (a total of \$35 million) will be allocated for parish needs and thirty percent (a total of \$15 million) will fund the diocese's coordination and support of various ministries. Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for Proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday. Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Lent, March 11, 2018 - John 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life..." Everyone who lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

Commentary:

This gospel sets forth the tensions of Christian life in a series of contrasts: believe-not believe, light-darkness, and live in truth because God has loved us and sent his Son to show us the way that we might not perish but have eternal life.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. What is God saying to me in this Gospel passage?
2. What word or phrase in this Gospel speaks to me?
3. What word or phrase in the Reflection resonates with me?
